Members of the Victim Assistance Team contact crime victims, primarily at the request of the Manhattan **Beach Police Department. If a** member is dispatched to an incident (call-out), they provide support and assistance not only to the police officer at the scene, but also to the victims involved. When appropriate, **VAT** members will contact victims via mail, which includes an introductory letter, additional resources and/or crime prevention information. Victims may also be contacted by a team member via phone call to provide further follow up assistance.

The Victim Assistance Team welcomes those who are interested and live in Manhattan Beach to apply. Confidentiality is of primary importance and selected candidates must pass a thorough background check, to include a polygraph examination.
