Training

Police volunteers may receive training in but not limited to:

- Orientation (Facility Tour, Policy & Procedure Overview and Department Structure)
- Crime Prevention/Community Affairs
- CPR and First Aid
- Introduction to Law
- Driver Awareness
- Patrol Procedures
- Traffic Control
- Radio Communications
- Basic Report Writing
- Victim Assistance

Volunteers must complete the Community Police Academy, as well as one ride-along with a Patrol Officer as part of the training program.
