DISCUSSION:

The Contractor has completed 19% of the construction contract. Work accomplished since the last progress payment includes demolition of the Strand from 31st Street to 34th Street, construction of the westerly concrete curb at this area, and construction of the concrete walkway in a portion of this area.

Agenda Item #:	
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The Contractor is currently installing a stormceptor at 32^{nd} Street and the Strand. The Contractor will then proceed to construct the concrete walkway from 32^{nd} Street to 34^{th} Street. Demolition of the Strand will continue from 34^{th} Street to 36^{th} Street.

The City is still waiting for Southern California Edison (SCE) to complete their portion of the electrical service upgrade work so that the new lights in Phase I (36th Street to 45th Street) will be operational. SCE staff has informed the Public Works Department that this work will commence on November 2, 2005 and will be completed shortly thereafter. Additionally, the new trash receptacles and benches are scheduled to be installed in Phase I on November 14, 2005.

The Contractor has submitted a request for Progress Payment No. 7 in the net amount of \$41,469.75. All work items covered by this payment have been reviewed by the Public Works Department and found to be in conformance with the plans and specifications.
