**SUBJECT:** Request by Councilmember Aldinger to Authorize the Mayor to Sign a Letter of

Support to the Southern California Association of Governments Regarding the

California Regional Blueprint Planning Grant Program.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the City Council **APPROVE** the request to authorize the Mayor to sign the support letter.

#### **FISCAL IMPLICATION:**

There are no fiscal implications associated with the recommended action, although Grant funding will potentially become available through the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG).

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Governor Schwarzenegger is launching a new \$5 million competitive grant program for Metropolitan Planning Organizations. It is called the California Regional Blueprint Planning Program, and it is designed to help regions prepare and implement voluntary growth visioning plans, such as the SCAG Southern California Compass and its 2% Implementation Strategy.

On September 1, 2005, the SCAG Regional Council approved Resolution #05-466-2, authorizing SCAG staff to apply for, accept and manage a Regional Blueprint Planning Grant and to collaborate with other stakeholders in the grant program. The Regional Council also requested that SCAG staff secure letters of support from cities in the region.

On behalf of Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger, I am pleased to announce the California Regional Blueprint Planning Program. The Regional Blueprint Planning Program is a complement to the Governor's "GoCalifornia" initiative to significantly improve the transportation system. This program will provide grants to help California's regions plan for future growth and quality of life through integration of transportation, housing, land use, economic development and environmental protection. This integration will result in a more efficient and effective transportation system and land use pattern to achieve the three outcomes (3Es) that define quality of life – prosperous economy, quality environment, and social equity (more equal opportunity) – for all Californians.

Governor Schwarzenegger has made \$5 million available per year in Fiscal Year 2005/2006 for the voluntary preparation of Regional Blueprint Plans. The funds will be awarded by the Business, Transportation and Housing Agency in December 2005 with projects to start January 2006. The program will be administered by the Department of Transportation, Division of Transportation Planning, in cooperation with the Department of Housing and Community Development.

We anticipate working closely with you to further advance comprehensive regional blueprint scenario planning in California with new growth scenario models and mapping tools, innovative public engagement techniques, and better integration of transportation, housing, land use, jobs-housing balance, economic development and environmental protection. The two-year Regional Blueprint Planning Program should result in comprehensive plans for most of the urbanized areas and best practices for completing the process statewide.

Demonstrating a commitment to partnering with SCAG by ensuring a local match of at least 20% will make our collective application stronger.

We are excited about this opportunity to help further our collective vision for Southern California and shared values of improving mobility, increasing livability and prosperity, and creating a sustainable environment. Demonstrating local support for the Compass Vision will help secure more Blueprint funds for the entire region.
