SUBJECT: Introduction of Fiscal Year 2005-2006 Proposed Budget & Capital Improvement Plan

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council accept the presentation of the Fiscal Year 2005-2006 Proposed Budget and Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). No other action is required at this time.

FISCAL IMPLICATION:

There are no fiscal implications associated with the recommended action.

DISCUSSION:

Staff is pleased to present the proposed operating budget and CIP for Fiscal Year 2005-2006. Both documents are the culmination of several months of work on the part of all departments as well as Finance and Public Works staff.

As in past years, the budget document presents detailed information about each department's operations, service indicators, goals and accomplishments, staffing levels, funding sources and proposed expenditures. The CIP includes a five year plan of major improvement projects year-by-year, and includes funding source information and descriptions of the projects. Additionally, the CIP has been reviewed by the Parking and Public Improvement Commission and Planning Commission.

Tonight we will be presenting a brief document and financial overview. In-depth discussions and presentations will take place at the Council Study Session on May 24th. A Public Hearing and adoption is scheduled for June 7th. As we have done in past years, we will be holding workshops for public participation in the budget process as follows:
