SUBJECT: Consider an Adult Crossing Guard at Rowell Avenue and Gates Avenue

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission pass a motion to recommend that the City Council authorize a crossing guard at Rowell Avenue and Gates Avenue.

BACKGROUND:

The City currently provides 20 adult crossing guards at 19 locations throughout the City. Each crossing guard costs around \$12,000 per year.

On June 1, 2016, the City received a request from the Pennekamp PTA Board and Principal Dr. Toni Brown, for a crossing guard at the intersection of Rowell Avenue and Gates Avenue adjacent to Pennekamp Elementary School. The request was subsequently supported by approximately 23 emails from residents and parents for a crossing guard and other measures near the school. (Exhibit 1)

DISCUSSION:

The intersection of Rowell Avenue and Gates Avenue is located in a residential area west of Pennekamp Elementary School. Gates Avenue terminates at the intersection, which is stopped in all directions. The Pennekamp parking lot driveway forms the east leg of the intersection. Both streets are two-lane Local roadways with 25 MPH speed limits. There are sidewalks on the west side of Rowell Avenue and both sides of Gates Avenue. There are marked crosswalks on the south and west legs of the intersection. Curb parking is allowed on both streets, except for street sweeping restrictions. (Exhibit 2)

The traffic collision history between January 1, 2006 and December 31, 2015 was analyzed for the subject intersection. According to City records, there were no pedestrian collisions at the intersection of Rowell Avenue and Gates Avenue during this period. However, there was a collision on June 15, 2016, in which a southbound driver collided with another vehicle and overturned near this intersection.

Pedestrian Counts

Pedestrian volume counts were taken in September 2016 and March 2017 on normal school days with good weather. Traffic volumes were collected from the City's latest records. A summary and pedestrian and traffic counts are provided below:

The cross-product is an indication of the relative exposure of pedestrians to vehicle traffic, and is comprised of the student pedestrian volume multiplied by the conflicting traffic volume for the AM and PM peak hours. A comparison of this location to other intersections with crossing guards is attached as Exhibit 3.

It should be noted that the west and south legs of Rowell Avenue and Gates Avenue are on the Suggested Routes to Pennekamp Elementary School map. (Exhibit 4) In addition, the City was awarded a State Safe Routes to School Grant in 2011, to install flashing stop beacons at the intersection, which will be constructed in the summer.

Field Observations

Field observations were made at Rowell Avenue and Gates Avenue on typical school days. These observations confirm the traffic count data and high pedestrian activity. A large number of students use the crosswalks on the south and west legs of the intersection. The south leg directly connects with the school entrance walkway. While there are no crosswalks on the east and north legs, although a few pedestrians were observed crossing the street near these two legs when walking to/from parked vehicles in the vicinity. These pedestrians were included in the overall pedestrian counts. A majority of pedestrians were observed walking to or from vehicles parked on the surrounding streets.

The intersection has adequate sight distance for motorists stopped at the stop signs. Proper right-of-way rules are currently established by the existing all-way stop controls. Heavy curb parking demand occurs during school dismissal. However, any vehicles parked or waiting close to the intersections may partially block the view of approaching traffic and pedestrians waiting to cross the street. Therefore, the Traffic Engineer has issued work orders to paint red curbs on all corners to clarify the prohibited parking areas, and to improve visibility of pedestrians trying to cross at several intersections along Rowell Avenue.

Adult Crossing Guards

The State of California guidelines for the installation of adult crossing guards were reviewed at this intersection. These guidelines state that adult crossing guards are desirable at stop-controlled crossings on a four-lane street where the traffic volume exceeds 500 vehicles during each of any two hours in which 40 school pedestrians cross in each of any two hours during the day. However, adult crossing guards may also be considered if special problems exist which make it necessary to assist elementary school pedestrians in crossing the street, such as at an unusually complicated intersection with frequent turning movements and high vehicular speeds. The specific guidelines are in the California Manual on Traffic Control Devices Section 7D.02, as described below:

Adult crossing guards may be used to provide gaps in traffic at school crossings where an engineering study has shown that adequate gaps need to be created (see Section 7A.03), and where authorized by law. Adult Crossing Guards may be assigned at designated school crossings to assist school pedestrians at specified hours when going to or from school. The following suggested policy for their assignment applies only to crossings.

Guidance:

An Adult Crossing Guard should be considered when:

- A. Special situations make it necessary to assist elementary school pedestrians in crossing the street.
- B. A change in the school crossing location is being made, but prevailing conditions require school crossing supervision until the change is constructed and it is not reasonable to install another form of traffic control or technique for this period.

Criteria for Adult Crossing Guards:

Support:

Adult Crossing Guards normally are assigned where official supervision of school pedestrians is desirable while they cross a public highway, and at least 40 school pedestrians for each of any two hours (not necessarily consecutive) daily use the crossing while going to or from school.

Ontion:

Adult crossing guards may be used under the following conditions:

- At uncontrolled crossings where there is no alternate controlled crossing within 600 feet; and

 In urban areas where the vehicular traffic volume exceeds 350 during each of any two hours (not
 necessarily consecutive) in which 40 or more school pedestrians cross daily while going to or from
 school; or
 - b. In rural areas where the vehicular traffic volume exceeds 300 during each of any two hours (not necessarily consecutive) in which 30 or more school pedestrians cross daily while going to or from school.
 - Whenever the critical (85th percentile) approach speed exceeds 40 mph, the guidelines for rural areas should be applied.
- 2. At stop sign-controlled crossing:
 - Where the vehicular traffic volumes on undivided highways of four or more lanes exceeds 500 per hour during any period when the school pedestrians are going to or from school.
- 3. At traffic signal-controlled crossings:
 - a. Where the number of vehicular turning movements through the school crosswalk exceeds 300 per hour while school pedestrians are going to or from school; or
 - b. Where justified through analysis of the operations of the intersection.

As shown on the attached Adult Crossing Guard Evaluation Form (Exhibit 5), the intersection meets the minimum pedestrian warrant but does not meet the traffic volume warrant or minimum number of lanes. While this intersection does not meet all of the suggested State guidelines for adult school crossing guards, it should be noted that several existing crossing guards are located at stop signs that would otherwise not meet current warrants. The City may choose to provide crossing guards at locations that meet the general guidance advice on the basis of an engineering study or policy. There are 10 locations with existing crossing guards that do not meet State guidelines. Alternately, the City can choose to relocate an existing crossing guard from another location that has a lower pedestrian-vehicle exposure than the proposed location. In such cases,

the City has utilized a ranking method to identify the locations with the highest vehicle-pedestrian conflicts, and prioritized them when funds for additional guards are limited.

The Traffic Engineer believes that the high number of school age pedestrians can justify the assignment of a crossing guard at this location. Also, this location is the main crosswalk to the front of the school and serves all students that live to the west. There are existing crossing guards at locations with fewer student pedestrians that can be considered for potential relocation, such as Manhattan Beach Boulevard at Peck Avenue, which has a traffic signal to assist pedestrian crossings.

CONCLUSION:

Based on minimum State guidelines, an adult school crossing guard is not justified at the intersection of Rowell Avenue and Gates Avenue at this time. However, due to the high school pedestrian crossing volume and proximity to the front school entrance, staff recommends the assignment of an adult crossing guard at this location, either by relocating an existing guard or funding a new guard.

Just as school was getting out today, a car came speeding down Rowell from 2nd street and barreled into 3 other cars, before flipping onto its side. There were tons of kids around and this could have been catastrophic for our community. Kids were traumatized and parents were horrified at the scene and proximity to their path. We had Pennekamp teachers, parents and principal all bravely handling the situation. This photo is taken from my front door on Rowell - looking at the Pennekamp parking lot. There needs to be at least two speed bumps on Rowell, between 2nd street and Gates - and the crosswalk needs a guard. We have no pedestrian support for safety on this side of the school. Unfortunately I see people speeding on this stretch of Rowell every single day. There is a cross walk and stop sign on the corner of Gates and Rowell, however no one even stops properly at that stop sign. I have never seen any sort of police enforcement on this stretch of road and it's a huge problem. Not to mention its a school zone.






