I have just recently been able to review the staff comments from the May 16 meeting on the chip trail maintenance (although the staff report explicitly said that maintenance was not part of the report.

The Captions transcript is below.

"The park trail itself is a nature trail. There is no policy for what standards would or would not be used for the park. The park is relatively level. All of us who have used it know the chips over time do get shuffled around and our staff mitigate those. But we don't have a standard that if we are aware or look for a pot hole for lack of a better word better word or description, that we run down and repair it.

We just don't provide that level of constant oversight to see whether that is happening or not. From my personal use of it, when you have dogs who dig or people who run, the trail does get used in a variety of ways and over time those pot holes form and go away."

The above hyperbole does not serve anyone except the person trying to deflect attention from their lack of performance.

First, the park trail is not itself, nor primarily, a nature trail. There are more references in recent city documents to "jogging path" or "running trail." In fact, I'll leave the issue to the City's website, that describes Veterans Parkway as "It includes a 1.5 mile jogging trail." Neither the Veterans Parkway Master Plan or Mobility Plan describes this as a "nature trail." In basic legal construct, when there are no standards developed, the default is to the standards implied by its intended utilization.

The problems I have been referencing are not "chips shuffling around." It is the underlying surface. Certainly a "pothole" might develop from time to time from a digging dog (although in 25 years of use I haven't seen that ever to be anything but an anomaly, at best). The problem is the change to the underlying surface from the Hometown Fair, roots, water erosion, subsidence, or a number of other factors. I would assert that running heavy equipment or even pickup trucks on the path is contributorynot shuffling runners. But to be absolutely clear THE PROBLEM IS NOT THE CHIPS. THE CHIPS ARE FINE.

Unlike what is asserted in the comments, Public Works does not take the opportunity to level the undersurface when new chips are applied. At best, the chips are spread in a way to try to mask the uneven undersurface. This is very apparent where new chips were put down after the Hometown Fair across from Josyln.

I am not asking for a "groomed running track" (as was asserted by the CM back in November), nor anyone to "run down and repair" anything. There are no "potholes," but there are certainly significant humps and troughs, or moghuls and dips.

The jamming impact on knees and ankles of these when running (especially when one is 60 years old, 200 lbs and 5′ 10″) are akin to stepping off a curb that you didn't see was there--and that's even when one recognizes the dip you're hitting--remember one is running at the time and thus the impact is more significant.

Or, the effect is like stubbing a toe and stumbling forward while going up a curb. The fact that the mounds and troughs are random, asymmetrical and inconsistent pulls one's hips, feet ankles and knees in ways you don't want them to--and on a very constant and consistent basis. I recognize those conditions will always be somewhat present, but I'm not asking for perfection--just some due diligence and attention to get this to better form.

Yes, over the 1.5 mile length the pathway is "relatively level," but there are problems that need remedied every 10 yards. Last Sunday, from Longfellow to 8th Street, I counted about 100 of what I would call "unsatisfactory repairable conditions" and not one "chip shuffling" or "dog dig."

And as far as needing additional budget, in my opinion a quick bobcat scrape would do the trick. It does not need a "rototill." Although I don't think additional budget should be necessary for such basic maintenance. And if money is a problem for something so rudimentary, I laugh at our AAA rating.

I am not looking for "constant care," but I am looking for assurance that the problem is recognized and that a program is developed, timely scheduled and funded to bring this condition not only to the standard of what one expects from a jogging trail, but also to the standard of what one expects for a city with Manhattan Beach expectations. If nothing else, these sorts of amenities can also be attractive for tourism.

And, as always, the instant problem isn't as bad as staff's attempt to cloud the situation and, frankly, out-and-out lie, conflate, hyperbolize or gaslight about the complaint, the condition and the expectation. One cannot participate in government when confronted by disingenuous staff, and a City Council that is aware of that condition and does nothing to correct.
