SUBJECT: Declare Vacancy: Library Commission, Seat No. 4 (Wagner)

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council pass a motion to declare vacant Library Commission Seat No. 4 (Wagner).

FISCAL IMPLICATION:

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.

BACKGROUND:

The Library Commission consists of five (5) members and serves in an advisory capacity to the City Council regarding library services provided by the Los Angeles County Library System to the Citizens of Manhattan Beach.

DISCUSSION:

On December 28, 2004, the City Clerk's Office received a memo from Parks and Recreation Director Richard Gill and Recreation Services Manager Mark Leyman indicating that Chris Wagner, who holds Seat No. 4 on the Library Commission, has stepped down due to his inavailability to attend the Commission meetings.

Per Ordinance 1975, if a vacant seat has 18 months or less remaining in its term, the new member would be appointed to complete the original term of office (expiring May 31, 2005) and then automatically be re-appointed to a three-year term without further ceremony. Following the three-year term, the member would be eligible for re-appointment by the City Council to one more three-year term.

As such, the new member appointed to this seat will complete the original term of office (expiring May 31, 2005) and then be eligible for reappointment to one succeeding three-year term.

Upon Council's approval to declare this seat vacant, staff will advertise the vacancy in the January 27, 2005 edition of the Beach Reporter and post the vacancy on City Hall bulletin boards and on the City's web site. Staff will accept new applications and contact those persons who have submitted an application within the last three years, including current Commissioners, who have expressed an interest in the Library Commission. In order to have time to advertise and obtain an ample pool of applicants, staff recommends that the new Commissioner be appointed at the second City Council meeting in February (February 15, 2005).
