Personal Emergency Supply Kit Check List

Make sure everyone in your household knows the location of Emergency Kit and inspect kit annually. Check batteries and food expiration dates. Update supplies as needed.

- □ Medications, prescription list and copies of medical cards, doctor's contact info
- Eye glasses, spare contacts lenses and cleaning solution
- □ Baby formula
- □ Pet food and extra water for your pet
- □ Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, driver's license or personal identification cards and bank account records in a water proof portable container
- Emergency cash (ATM's might not work) small bills and coins are best
- □ Sturdy shoes, jacket and blankets
- □ Change of clothing
- □ List of emergency out-of-area contact phone numbers
- □ Flashlight and extra batteries

- Dust mast work gloves and protective goggles
- □ Personal hygiene supplies
- □ Toiletries and special provisions you need for your family or yourself
