Sudden Cardiac Arrest is a life-threatening emergency that occurs when the heart unexpectedly stops beating.

Survival depends on the quick actions of people nearby to call 911, start CPR, and use an AED* to restart the heart.




Sudden Cardiac Arrest affects more than 356,000 people outside hospitals each year in the U.S. It strikes seemingly healthy people of all ages, including 7,000 children and teens.



Today only 1 in 10 victims survives SCA, but 5 in 10 could survive if bystanders gave CPR and used AEDs immediately.

Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) leads to death within minutes if the person does not receive immediate help.

The chances of survival from SCA decrease by 10% every minute without CPR.
