The meeting was called to order at 6:06 PM.

F. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION (3-Minute Limit)

Commissioner Turkmany opened the floor to audience participation. Seeing none, the floor was closed.

G. GENERAL BUSINESS

Polliwog Park Play Equipment Design Presentations

<u>Great Western</u> – Nate Younker, representative. Great Western is the distributor for GameTime playgrounds, under the umbrella of Playcore. Mr. Younker stated that the goal of the playground design is to create as exciting a play area as possible within the safety parameters. Based on feedback received at the April 29th, community meeting, he presented a redesign. The design retained the existing lighthouse and cement boat and incorporates a 12 ft. enclosed slide and a timber playhouse in a pond setting. The design features 6 slides and a Stratosphere net off an 8 ft. deck along with 4 musical elements. Cattail spinners and misting rocks were included the lighthouse area. He reviewed equipment finishes, and construction and material details. Based on feedback that the image on the pirate ship was scary, the ship was removed from the original design.

<u>Miracle Playground</u> – John Jason – Berliner – local rep for Miracle with multiple lines. Mr. Jason presented his design which featured rope elements and a clubhouse along with precast concrete forms. His design featured and enclosed slide and a DNA climber with play features accessible from both inside and outside. He stated that even though the playgrounds are

marked for 5-12 year olds, older kids like to play on playgrounds as well, but they are not really made for them. His design is appealing for the older kids as well with many climbing opportunities. He reviewed materials and warranty information. The design includes a rocking element that accommodate six to eight children at one time and an ADA inclusive spinner for 10 children.

<u>RecWest</u> – Nate Stutz – representing Landscape Structures. Mr. Stutz approached the design from a playability perspective. The design features a large net structure, boulders and pads allowing children to traverse across a large area without ever touching the ground. Shade was incorporated for caretakers. An ADA friendly Omnispinner that can accommodate up to 15 children was included. He reviewed materials and warranty and added that as a lean manufacturer, parts are made to order so will always be available. He added that inclusivity is a main component of Landscape Structures. On every play element, there is a breakdown of how they are developmentally functional.

Kompan – Grant Bauer – Mr. Bauer stated that he wants to make the park a landmark and celebrate nature, the lake, the community and its special interests. The design includes a 26 ft. long by 19ft. tall wood pirate ship, birdwatch tower and cattail reed climbing elements. The design includes many ADA friendly elements and highlights nature with wildlife elements. The surfacing features the lifecycle of the polliwog. There are many different opportunities and methods to get to the slides (graduated difficulty) and various levels of shading were incorporated. Kompan has been in business since 1970.

Director Leyman advised the commission to pick the ideal playground design from which the RFP will be designed. Commissioner Greenberg clarified that all the companies started with the same parameters and designed what they could offer for \$1,000,000.

Commissioner Greenberg thanked the four representatives for their presentation, complimented staff on reaching out to the community and thanked the community members for participating. He added that he is data driven and the data from the first meeting showed a clear delineation with Kompan and RecWest standing out. His own personal reactions match the survey results.

Commissioner Karger agreed regarding Kompan and RecWest. Commissioner Nicholson loves the pirate ship. Also agrees that RecWest was good but they were all good and that any one of the designs would be successful. Commissioner Karger likes the DNA tower and wondered if the Kompan equipment is challenging enough. Commissioner Turkmany acknowledged that every company really tried to incorporate at Manhattan Beach theme.

Commissioner Weiner liked the attention to detail of the Kompan design, and the scale of the Great Western design. Commissioner Apostol really liked the challenge of RecWest.

Sr. Recreation Manager, Jessica Vincent reminded the commissioners to consider all aspects including the history of the park, playability and the community desires when judging the designs.

The commissioners ranked the designs as shown below. Commissioner Greenberg moved to eliminate Great Western and Miracle based on the results. Commissioner Turkmany seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The commission recessed for 10 minutes and reconvened at 8:46 p.m.

The two remaining companies were invited to clarify a few points and make final statements.

Kompan – the President of North Americas, stated that the intentionality of the Kompan brand is key. Every aspect of Kompan equipment is designed with intention. The rope is 19 cm around because that is ideal for children's hands. If selected after the RFP, Kompan would provide the turnkey solution with an internal project manager, managing the sub-contractors. Commissioner Weiner asked about alternatives, and Mr. Bauer replied that the design is flexible. He mentioned that some of the metal structures are made from powder coated steel posts that have been hot dipped galvanized that will not rust through if water gets in. If the powder coating is damaged and the pole is exposed, it will not rust. Commissioner Greenberg asked if they could write into the contract that the warranty would not be voided due to the flooding. Mr. Bauer added that the Rubinia wood used in the pirate ship will not splinter. It is a natural product and there may be some cracking that happens with the drying process. Kompan comes out and monitors for the first 2 years. They will come quarterly to monitor the expansion and contraction until the wood is acclimatized.

RecWest – Mr. Stutz stated that his philosophy is that play is the most important element in a playground. At the end of the day, we're building for the end user, the children. Every element in his design is intentionally there for playability. He wanted to make the whole area into one big play event with diversity of play. He wanted the net structure but wanted to bring in nature with adventurescapes. There is a travel climber, the top is a bridge but the bottom is a monkey bar. There are five different spinning elements.

He added that the commission is not just choosing a playground manufacturer, they are choosing a representative for the life of the playground. RecWest has a local office. The playground will need to be maintained and he is responsible for it. Every playground looks great and works great for the first few years. He stated that with RecWest there will always be parts and a representative. Each product has a slightly different warranty. Steel posts have a 100 year warranty; plastics, 15 years; shades, 10 years. Commissioner Nicholson stated that the flooding could be written into the contract.

The commission voted for their favorite as shown below:

Commissioner Greenberg moved to put the final designs out to the public and come back next month to discuss and choose. Commissioner Weiner seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Joint Commission meeting Workplan items – Commissioner Weiner stated that accomplishments should be conveyed at the Joint Commission meeting.

Director Leyman clarified that the commission's role in the Senior/Scouthouse is to support fundraising activities and receive updates from the older adult representative. It was proposed to take this item off the workplan as it is just an update item, much like the CIP update item. Director Leyman will clarify whether or not these items should be on the workplan. Director Leyman will convey the format of the meeting as soon as it is determined. Commissioner Greenberg asked to add the Olympics Beach Volleyball research to the list of accomplishments. The City Council received a detailed recommendation to not pursue the volleyball event as it would not be a significant benefit to the residents. Commercial opportunities were identified and subsequently handed off to the Chamber of Commerce. He stated that development of new Parks Master Plan to set strategic goals for the Parks for the next 10 years, should be added.

Commissioner Turkmany moved to select Commissioner Wiener for Commission Chair and Commissioner Greenberg for Vice-Chair for the 2019-2020 term. Commissioner Karger seconded the motion. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

SUBJECT: Polliwog Playground Renovations APPROVE

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Parks & Recreation Commission direct staff to include the Polliwog Playground conceptual designs developed by Kompan into the Request for Proposals Design Element Guidelines and Play System Specifications.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

The estimated total cost of the project is \$1,000,000. City Council has approved an allocation of \$600,000 through Proposition A grant funding and appropriated \$400,000 from the Capital Improvement Project fund for the design and construction of the play equipment and surfacing at lower Polliwog Park.

BACKGROUND:

Polliwog Parks original play area was build by members of a City service group in the 1970's with a large play area including a sunken wooden galleon. In 2003, the play structure was replaced with modernized equipment, including a fenced in area for two through five year olds with bay swings and a play structure, a common area with a concrete ship and sand, and a lighthouse with a fogging system and boulders and a second area for youth ages five to 12 with slides and a play structure.

DISCUSSION:

The park continues to be a regional asset that is routinely utilized by people from community and surrounding cities. The existing play equipment and particularly the surfacing area have reached their useful life and are in disrepair and need to be replaced. Due to safety concerns, a substantial portion of the existing play equipment is now off limits to users. Renovations will help to reduce liability, safety, improve accessibility and meet the needs of the community.

Project improvements include:

- Replace existing play equipment maintaining the natural theme of Polliwog Park with equipment that can withstand flooding from the pond (new amenities include: play area for two to five years, play area for five to 12 years, swings, climbers, and balance features)
- Improve ADA access to all play equipment
- Replace existing fence
- Replace surfacing

On May 28, 2019 four playground manufactures, RecWest, Great West Playgrounds, Miracle, and Kompan provided potential designs to the Parks & Recreation Commission. The Commission reviewed the initial design proposals, and ranked Kompan and RecWest's designs equal; therefore, the Parks & Recreation Commission directed Staff to seek additional public input.

A survey inviting the community to select a final design was posted on Open City Hall on June 7, 2019. Kompan and RecWest were provided the following criteria for design

- All equipment must be CPSC and ASTM compliant
- Removal of palm trees is permitted to enhance or expand play area
- Fencing around the 2-5 year area must be included
- Refurbish or Replace the Lighthouse with a new feature to cover the manhole

The topic received 973 visitors and 207 responses. That's 10.4 hours of public comment @ 3 minutes per response. The deadline for participation was 8:00am on June 20, 2019. Over 76% of respondents selected Kompan as their design of choice, with great support for the inclusion of the historical galleon and nature inspired designs. Additional feedback includes:

- Increased shaded areas
- Increased seating for parents
- Include water features, such as a splash pad

PUBLIC OUTREACH/INTEREST:

The Polliwog Playground renovation project is of much interest to the community. The initial public meeting was held on April 29, 2019 at the Manhattan Heights Community Center and there was an attendance of 53. The meeting was publicly noticed through social media, Parks & Rec e-blasts, MBUSD school newsletters, and ad was placed in the Beach Reporter. Additionally, the Parks & Recreation Commission Meeting was held on May 28.

The survey was posted twice on Open City Hall, May 9 through May 23 and June 7 through June 19. Ads were placed in the Beach Reporter and the item was marketed through social media and e-blasts.

CONCLUSION:

Staff recommends that the Parks & Recreation Commission direct staff to include the Polliwog Playground conceptual designs developed by Kompan into the Request for Proposals Design Element Guidelines and Play System Specifications.

Proposed Donation Policy and Donation Program Options (Parks and Recreation Director Leyman).

BACKGROUND:

At the January 3, 2018 City Council meeting, Council directed staff to review additional options for Strand Alcove Bench and Tree and Bench Donation programs and return to City Council with an update at a future meeting. Specifically, maintain but suspend the current programs until certain program elements can be clarified, including adding consistent donor recognition language for both strand alcove and park benches and a specific term for the donation. In addition, Council directed staff to explore alternative donation programs.

At the June 6, 2018 work plan meeting, City Council directed staff to draft a comprehensive donation policy and explore donation programs to include donated tiles.

The Parks and Recreation Commission established an ad-hoc committee to create a donation policy and evaluate program options. The Committee met six times to draft the policy and presented their findings at several Commission meetings. The donation policy and programs were approved for City Council consideration on May 28, 2019.

DISCUSSION:

The Parks and Recreation Commission discussed the policy at their January, February, March, April and May meetings. Much of the discussion focused on establishing a comprehensive policy that would create a "umbrella" process and guidelines for donations. The Commission looked at comparable policies as well as a draft policy that was prepared in 2002 by the Commission that eventually focused solely on the Public Art Master Plan donation section. The Art Donation Policy requires that any gifts of cultural or historic significance proposed to any City department be reviewed by the Cultural Arts Commission. This also applies to proposed works for long-term loan to the City (more than one year).

The Commission intentionally designed the umbrella policy to address the donation process, and not each individual program. The policy allows for flexibility to add or delete programs at Council's discretion.

The umbrella policy establishes a uniform process for donation in public parks, facilities

and open space on City property or public easements. The objective of the policy is to ensure uniformity and a timeline for requests, facilitate and encourage donations, and provide opportunities for residents to create a vested connection to place and community. The policy defines types of donations, the process for application or proposal, implementation guidelines and includes language limiting the City's liability, and responsibility for maintenance to the useful life of the donation.

Separately, programs options were developed to provide a range of donation opportunities. The following are the proposed donation programs:

1) Park Amenity Catalog:

The park amenity catalog is an expanded version of the tree and bench donation program. In addition to trees and benches, catalog options may include: picnic pads, drinking fountains, water filling stations, big belly solar trash receptacles, bike racks and barbecues. These items along with other park amenities will be added to the catalog as items are in need of replacement. The initial catalog offerings will be established based on the needs assessment associated with Park Master Plan through the Parks and Recreation Commission and City staff.

<u>*Purpose*</u>: To replace park amenities and recognize community members or organizations.

Location: All City parks and public spaces

<u>*Process*</u>: Donor would select and purchase item from the online catalog. Staff will install amenity and provide donor recognition.

<u>*Cost*</u>: Varies by amenity - Parks and Recreation and Public Works will develop appropriate pricing including cost of materials and installation for each catalog item. Donor recognition for each item will vary by amenity and will be established prior to inclusion in the catalog.

2) Paver Donation Program:

<u>*Purpose*</u>: To recognize community members or organizations.

Location: Walkway outside of the post office on 15th Street (Attachment).

<u>*Process*</u>: Donor would purchase paver with approved recognition wording. Staff will install paver.

<u>Cost</u>: To Be Determined

3) Mosaic Community Mural – Civic Center Plaza (Attachment)

Purpose: Provide public art and recognize community members or organizations.

Location: Civic Plaza corrugated metal walls on walkway from City Hall to Police/Fire facility.

<u>*Process*</u>: Sponsors would purchase tiles within the mural. The mosaic wall and artist will be selected through an RFQ process with review from the Cultural Arts Commission and Arts in Public Places Committee, with recommendations to the City Council.

<u>*Cost*</u>: Cost will be determined by the size of each mosaic tile. The cost for the artist to create the mural may be subsidized by the Public Art Trust Fund.

4) Military Banner Program:

<u>*Purpose*</u>: Program would recognize our community's men and women in uniform who are currently serving the Armed Forces, veterans who have served in the past, or veterans of the past.

<u>Location</u>: Recommended- Manhattan Beach Blvd. and available space to be determined on a first-come, first-served basis. All banner locations shall be determined by the City.

<u>*Process*</u>: Street banners will be designed and printed by a third party company and installed by Public Works on an annual basis. The banners would be displayed for five months, from July - November to coincide with our Salute to the Troops and Veterans Day events. The banners, once removed will be given to the sponsor.

<u>Cost</u>: \$380 per banner (includes installation, hardware, banner)

5) Strand Alcove Bench Donation Program:

In addition to the above donation programs, the Parks and Recreation Commission suggests eliminating the Strand Alcove Bench Donation program. The Commission recommended elimination, as there are only seven existing locations, of which most of the recent donations are of a single design. The Commission believes that the City Council should select the benches and artists for the remaining alcoves.

The Commission also proposed the idea of adding a commemorative area for new development or capital projects, such as the Scout House.

PUBLIC OUTREACH/INTEREST:

The ad-hoc committee met 6 times to draft the policy and investigate program options. The donation policy was also discussed at the September and October, 2018 and January, February and March, 2019 Parks and Recreation Commission meetings.

LEGAL REVIEW

The City Attorney has reviewed this report and determined that no additional legal analysis is necessary.

CITY OF MANHATTAN BEACH DONATION POLICY

I. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish a uniform process for donations in public parks, facilities and open space on City property or public easements.

II. Authorization

The City Council shall retain final authority for accepting donations and/or authorizing any use of City owned property.

III. Objectives

- Ensure uniformity and a timeline for requests
- · Facilitate and encourage donations to the City
- Protect the integrity of City property
- Provide opportunities for residents to create a vested connection to place and community

IV. Qualifying Donations

- Community project enhancements, campaigns and/or services, such as Eagle Scout and youth program projects
- Tribute items, such as benches or trees, park amenities, banners, pavers and tiles
- Capital Improvement Projects (over \$50,000)

Artistic donations such as paintings, sculptures and murals will be considered under the Art Donation Policy from the Public Art Master Plan.

V. Donation Tiers

Donations will be processed (considered?) appropriately within the following tier system, dependent on the proposal location.

- Tier 1: City Donation Catalog The City of Manhattan Beach has created a catalog
 of items that may represent a benefit to the community but are not currently
 funded within the budget. It is recommended that all applicants with proposals
 review this catalog of approved items.
- Tier 2: Items NOT included in the City Donation Catalog and cash valued under \$10,000. Staff and Parks and Recreation Commission to review and approve.
- Tier 3: Items NOT included in the City Donation Catalog and Cash donations valued over \$10,000 – Cash donations may be designated for restricted or unrestricted use. The Parks and Recreation Commission will review gifts of cash with a restriction before being presented to the City Council for final approval.

V. City Donation Catalog

The City of Manhattan Beach has created a catalog of items that may represent a benefit to the community but are not currently funded within the budget. It is recommended that all applicants with proposals review this catalog of approved items.

VI. Process

- The following guidelines will be used when donating items:
 - 1. Application/Written Proposal

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Formatted: Heading 1, Justified, Indent: Left: 0.57", Right: 0.01", Space After: 0 pt, Tab stops: 0.57", Left + Not at 0.57" Applications should be submitted for all items in the City Donation Catalog and will be approved based on item availability. For items not in the City Donation Catalog, a written proposal must be submitted to the City of Manhattan Beach of Parks and Recreation Department for review. The proposal submitted should include: an explanation or scope of the proposed donation; specifications, including type, dimensions, material and proposed location; estimated value of the donation; and any other pertinent information.

2. General Criteria

The following criteria will be considered:

- any existing agreements
- any existing regulations or deeds
- proposal/scope
- easements/utilities
- existing structures
- quality/quantity of an object
- size of an object
- environmental concerns
- future or ongoing maintenance

- public safety
- estimated value
- relationship to the natural environment
- users of the proposed site
- future development plans
- landscape design, existing infrastructure
- visibility and accessibility
- Identification in City Donation Catalog

Public Works, Parks and Recreation Commission and/or City Council may review applications before making a decision. Donations made on property with a conservation easement or deed restriction shall require approval from the easement holder per the applicable easement or deed.

The City Council shall retain final authority for all use of City owned property. The Donor shall give up: ownership rights, right to alter, move or remove said donations without reservation, and maintenance obligation rights.

3. Timeline

Once an application is considered complete, (verified in writing) staff will process and respond to each application within 60 days of submittal (to allow time to process through Commission and City Council if needed). One of the following responses will be provided:

- a. Application acceptance and next steps for approval
- b. Application denial
- c. Application modification request which may include a general modification to the scope of the project

4. Donation Tiers

Donations will be processed appropriately within the following tier systemdependent on the proposal location.

- Tier 1: All items included in the City Donation Catalog
- Tier 2: Items NOT included in the City Donation Catalog and cash valued under \$10,000.
- Tier 3: Items NOT included in the City Donation Catalog and Cash donations
 valued over \$10,000 May be designated for restricted or unrestricted use.

The Parks and Recreation Commission will review gifts of cash with a restriction before being presented to the City Council for final approval.

VII. Implementation

The following guidelines are provided for the installation, construction or placement of any donated items:

1. Project and Process

An application, or agreement between the donor and the City will be prepared for each donation.

2. Funding

All costs including initial installation, labor and materials are the responsibility of the donor.

3. Installation

City staff will oversee and provide for the installation of all donated items. With the exception of Tier 1 donations, donor may be responsible for installation costs.

4. Location

City of Manhattan Beach reserves the right to amend and/or reject any location provided by the applicant. Unless specifically agreed to in writing, the City may, at any future date, elect in its sole discretion to remove or relocate the donation.

5. Vandalism & Maintenance

When an item is donated, City staff makes a commitment to reasonably maintain that item for its useful life in a manner consistent with other City property. The City will make reasonable efforts to repair damaged donated items. However, the City is not responsible for replacing items, including plaques, due to excessive damage or floss; or elements at the end of their useful life.

6. Recognition

a) Tier 1 - recognition identified in the City Donation Catalog.

- b) Tier 2 and 3 Staff will work with donor to determine appropriate recognition.
- c) Capital Improvement Projects Donors providing donations exceeding \$50,000 will work with staff to determine appropriate recognition.

7. Liability

In no event shall the City be liable for value or tax assertions/claims by the Donor. The Donor(s) agree(s) to hold the City harmless and indemnify the City for any and all claims which might arise from any person, entity or corporation, resulting from the Donor's use of the City property or right-of-way for installation purposes, or arising from the Donor's performance or improvement/item donated pursuant to this policy

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
