SUBJECT:

Request for Streetlight Removal at 516 Ardmore Avenue

RECOMMENDATION:

To allow residents to comment on the removal of an existing streetlight, a public hearing before the Parking and Public Utility Commission is recommended prior to consideration by the City Council.

FISCAL IMPLICATION:

Approval of this item will have no impact on the City's budget. The entire expense of removing the existing streetlight will be the responsibility of Southern California Edison.

DISCUSSION:

A letter of request to remove an existing streetlight located adjacent to the southwest (front) property corner of 516 Ardmore Avenue was submitted to the Department of Public Works Director. The subject streetlight is supported on an existing utility pole currently located in Utility Undergrounding Assessment District No. 2 and is scheduled to be removed and replaced with a new standard concrete streetlight pole at a future date. The property owner/resident at 516 Ardmore Avenue is requesting that the new standard concrete streetlight not be installed at this particular location because she believes this streetlight is unnecessary due to the number of existing streetlights in the immediate area.

The subject property is located on the 500 block between 5th and 6th Streets with a total of five properties fronting this portion of Ardmore Avenue. The nearest existing streetlight north of the subject request is approximately 107 feet away and the nearest existing streetlight to the south is approximately 155 feet away. Between 2nd Street and 9th Street along the east side of Ardmore Ave, there are a total of 13 streetlights averaging 3 lights per block and spaced at an average of 150 feet (min. at 107 ft, max. at 186 ft).

Properties located within a 500' radius of the subject address were notified of the public hearing before the PPIC to be held on Thursday, June 28, 2007. In response to the notices, two letters in support of the request have been received by staff and are attached to this report. The neighboring property owner/resident at 520 Ardmore Ave is in support of the request because of a concern with the glare from the existing streetlight. The property owner/resident at 529 Pacific Ave is in the opinion that this particular streetlight is unnecessary due to the two other lights already existing on the 500 block of Ardmore Ave.

CONCLUSION:

The City receives very few requests for the removal of streetlights. Staff has conducted a preliminary site investigation and given that the particular streetlight is mid-block and removal of the light would not adversely affect any intersection lighting, staff does not have any outstanding protest to the request at this time. However, since streetlights are a public asset with associated Streetlight Assessment District costs paid for by property owners; the appropriate action is to conduct a public hearing giving any nearby residents the opportunity to voice their support or objection in regards to this request.

In addition, as part of the community meetings held regarding the Undergrounding District No. 2 property owners were previously informed that although all overhead wires and wood utility poles would be removed by the process of undergrounding, streetlights would remain in their existing locations. Property owners were previously given the opportunity to voice their concerns regarding this issue.


Finally, a second identical request has recently been received by the Public Works Department.


