Thanks for reaching out and following up with me regarding TEDxManhattanBeach.

I think the key information that was missing from your budget discussion includes:

TEDxManhattan Beach has partnered with the City to make the event accessible to residents. The City's financial commitment was \$5,000 and TEDx offers deeply discounted tickets (\$35) to seniors and high school students versus the regular ticket price of \$95.

Here are senior / high school ticket sales for the past 5 years:

2016: 167 (Moved the event to MCHS where we have capacity of 1000+)

My name is Feras Adamo and I'm the owner of the only tobacco store in Manhattan Beach.

I'm emailing you regarding the upcoming city proposal to ban the sale of tobacco products within the city.

The new proposal will cause a major damage to my legal business. 90 percent of our sales are tobacco products and cigars, we have a cigar humidor and many Manhattan Beach residents are cigar smokers, and the same applies to cigarettes and tobacco products. We also serve to neighboring areas like Redondo and Hermosa.

I worked really hard to establish and build my business in 2015 . I invested a lot of money in doing so. all the money that I earned my entire life I put in this business, not including the time and the efforts to make it successful. I have a clean establishment and currently employing two full time employees in slow seasons and three full time employees in busy seasons not including my self. On top of that I have a binding lease, a lot of cigar and tobacco inventory, and a family to feed, so do my employees.

The upcoming proposal would definitely put us out of business and cause major economic damage to us. We are a tobacco store!!

The ban on tobacco sales would not only cause damage to my entire business but will also cause economic hard ship on my family. I have two kids and a wife and I'm the only person in the house hold that pays rent, bills, and puts food on the table. My wife doesn't work but takes care of our children. What would we do if the ban goes through and we go out of business??!! This is our livelihood and financially we can't survive without it. Moreover, what would happen to all the money that I have invested in tobacco products which's nearly \$200,000 not including related accessories? What would happen to the binding lease that I'm currently responsible for?

Moreover, my employees also rely on this job to pay their rent, bills and get by. It's their only source of income. What would happen to them if such proposal goes through and we have to shut down?

Banning the sale of tobacco products in our city will not make any smoker quit smoking, it will just drive them to next city to obtain it and we're the ones that will take the hit and the nearby businesses in neighboring cities will gain our customers and hard work.

Furthermore, my tobacco business doesn't only serve Manhattan Beach residents, but big percentage of my customers are from neighboring cities due to the fact that I'm not in the heart of Manhattan Beach, across the street is Redondo where a lot of my customers come from. Add to that the many tourists we get from nearby beach cities and LAX airport.

My establishment allows only 21 years of age and older customers to enter and I have signs posted all of over my store stating that. We only serve to adults and we follow city, county, federal, and state laws. Tobacco products are legal to sell in the entire country. Why us?!

In Addition, we're part of the economy and we play by the book. My business pays a lot of bills to all kinds of local and government agencies. We pay high taxes to the IRS and State Board, we pay monthly gross sales taxes (nearly \$14,000 a month or more) we pay the EDD, federal and income taxes, the city of Manhattan Beach business license

All of these agencies and businesses would be affected if the proposal goes through. Putting us out of business would not benefit anyone including the city.

We're not located in the heart of Manhattan Beach. Please make an exception for my business. I understand the city of Beverly Hills passed such proposal but had kept 1 or 2 tobacco retailers who are in the same situation as I am. Please consider such an exception if the proposal goes through, our entire business and livelihood is at stake. And please consider all the facts I have stated including the amount of inventory I have in tobacco products alone. I'm willing to provide proof of the high amount of taxes and bills we pay and also payroll.

Finally, since October 2014 I have worked really hard to establish my business legally in Manhattan Beach and I can't afford to have my hard work and investment go away. Please consider my situation and the consequences, loss, and pain that this proposal will cause.
