COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT

March 29, 2020

As the COVID-19 pandemic evolves, the City of Manhattan Beach will continue to provide updates. Information regarding the coronavirus is changing frequently. To help keep the community informed, the City of Manhattan Beach is providing daily updates featuring the latest news about COVID-19 and how the City is working to meet the needs of the community and protect public health.

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- The Older Adult Program has assisted over 100 people thus far, through the resource delivery program provided with the Older Adult Hotline, during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The City of Manhattan Beach, the local beach cities and the Beach Cities Health District (BCHD) have come together to encourage residents to promote being Safer at Home on social media during the COVID-19 pandemic. - The Public Works Department has deployed additional signage throughout the City to further advise residents and visitors of the closures and public health orders.

FEDERAL, STATE AND COUNTY UPDATES

- President Donald Trump announced that social distancing guidelines will be extended to April 30. Details of the guidelines will be finalized on Tuesday and will include a summary of findings, supporting data and strategy.
- The White House ordered the Department of Health and Human Services to compel General Motors to manufacture ventilators under the Defense Production Act (DPA).
- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has completed the assessment of eight state selected facilities to develop large-scale, supplemental hospital space as the state works to expand existing hospital capacity by up to 50,000 beds.
- The U.S. Navy hospital ship "Mercy" is operational in Los Angeles, has received its first patients, and will care for patients with non-COVID-19 health needs to relieve strains on local hospital systems.
- Supplies from the <u>Strategic National Stockpile</u> have arrived in California and are being distributed to medical facilities throughout the state.

- As of March 27, FEMA had obligated \$390 million in federal support for the state of California. On March 28, FEMA obligated an additional \$468 million to the state to reimburse costs related to COVID-19 response.
- Los Angeles County is providing <u>COVID-19</u>: <u>GIS Dashboards</u> with data compiled from local health departments and experts that cover topics ranging from park and program closures, confirmed cases of COVID-19, emergency proclamations and school and district closures throughout the county.

MANHATTAN BEACH OBJECTIVES

- Maintain Local, State, and National situational awareness in collaboration with LA County Public Health.
- Ensure information management and constant messaging.
- Provide for life safety of public, first responders and city employees.
- Ensure fiscal responsibility.
- Identify and plan for the logistic support needs of responders.
- Forecast potential contingencies and develop appropriate mitigation strategies.
- Ensure essential government services are maintained.
