# COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT April 2, 2020

## CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- COVID-19 Testing at South Bay Galleria In conjunction with the Beach Cities Health District, LA County will deploy a COVID-19 testing site at the South Bay Galleria (1815 Hawthorne Blvd., Redondo Beach, CA 90278). Patients are advised to not show up without an appointment. Anyone interested in getting tested must first be screened and register on covid19.lacounty.gov/testing. This first step determines eligibility to be tested. Individuals are asked basic questions including name, date of birth, address, and whether they are exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms such as fever, coughing, and difficulty breathing. The website (in real time) determines and confirms an individual's testing eligibility. Those who receive confirmation of testing eligibility will then be given a selection of testing sites, available appointment times to complete the test registration process. The registration number will be required information at the testing site. Visit <u>bchd.org/coronavirus</u> for more information.
- Drive-Up Testing Details All of the testing locations, including the South Bay Galleria, are "drive-up." Clients stay in their cars for tests (though pedestrian clients with appointments can be tested as well). The test is a self-administered oral swab, meaning clients must swab their own mouths/throats using instructions provided to them at the site. The testing process takes between 5 and 10 minutes; however, waiting times may vary. More information and frequently asked questions are available at covid19.lacounty.gov/testing.

## FEDERAL, STATE AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Restaurants Allowed to Sell Groceries via Delivery, Takeout, and Curbside Pickup – The Department of Public Health has issued guidelines permitting restaurants to sell groceries. Some restaurants had previously reinvented themselves as markets during the COVID-19 crisis and as a result had been shut down for operating without a grocery license. Restaurants offering grocery type products (e.g. raw ingredients, products, etc.) for retail sale may only include them on their menu for delivery or take-out.
- Homemade Cloth Face Masks Eric Garcetti, City of Los Angeles Mayor, and Barbara Ferrer, County Public Health Director are recommending citizens to wear

homemade cloth face masks when out in public running essential errands. Both advise it will be critical to slowing the spread of COVID-19. Health professionals are clear that no one should run out and try to purchase medical-grade equipment as that would lead to an even greater shortage of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for critical first responders. Where possible, face masks should be homemade.

- Cyber Actors Take Advantage of COVID-19 Pandemic to Exploit Increased Use of Virtual Environments - The FBI released a Public Service Announcement (PSA) on April 1, informing users that cyber actors are taking advantage of the increased use of virtual environments by exploiting vulnerabilities to steal sensitive information, target individuals and businesses performing financial transactions, and engage in extortion activities. As of March 30, the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) has received and reviewed more than 1,200 complaints related to COVID-19 scams. The PSA also contains information related to vulnerabilities in telework systems, Business Email Communication phishing scams observed, and recommendations for protection.
- Broadband and Telephone Connectivity Many telecommunication companies are working with the Federal Communications Commission to "Keep Americans <u>Connected.</u>" This pledge is designed to ensure that Americans do not lose their broadband or telephone connectivity during the COVID-19 pandemic.
