CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- **City Update on Enforcement Efforts** – Following the City’s announcement of a zero tolerance approach to social distancing, the City Manager will provide an update to the City Council tomorrow, April 6, informing the community of enforcement efforts.
- **Upcoming Regular City Council Meeting Cancellation** – As a reminder, the April 7, 2020, City Council meeting was cancelled. In lieu of two monthly meetings, the City Council is holding three weekly City Council meetings on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 8 AM. FEDERAL, STATE AND COUNTY UPDATES

- **L.A. County Ramps Up COVID-19 Drive-Up Testing Sites** – In addition to the testing sites already deployed, new drive-up testing sites are planned to open this week throughout LA County. Locations include: Martin Luther King Jr. Community Hospital, East Los Angeles and Santa Clarita. In addition, the County is in discussions with health care provider, AltaMed, to bring several urgent care facilities into the County’s testing network in underserved areas.
- **CDC Launches Weekly Report titled, “COVIDView”** - On April 3, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) launched [COVIDView](#), a weekly report that summarizes and interprets key indicators from a number of existing surveillance systems tracking the COVID-19 pandemic in the United States. This comprehensive report includes information related to COVID-19 outpatient visits, emergency

department visits, hospitalizations, and deaths, as well as laboratory data. Go to [COVIDView](#) to see the report.

- **COVID-19 Testing Task Force** – Governor Gavin Newsom has created a [COVID-19 Testing Task Force](#), a public-private collaboration that will work with stakeholders to rapidly boost testing capacity throughout the State of California.
- **State Requests Medical Supplies** - The state launched a new website, [covid19supplies.ca.gov](#) that allows individuals and companies to sign up to donate, sell or manufacture critical medical supplies needed to offset the supply shortage. The needed items include: ventilators, disposable N95 respirators, surgical masks, coveralls, surgical or exam gowns, disposable face shields, goggles, examination gloves, hand sanitizers, wipes, test kits, swabs, and viral testing media. If you have the means to assist at the state level, visit [covid19supplies.ca.gov](#) to start the process as supplies are needed. If you are an individual looking for an avenue to donate a smaller amount, the local community hospitals, [Providence Little Company of Mary Medical Center](#) and [Torrance Memorial](#) also appreciate COVID-19 donations.
