FEDERAL, STATE AND COUNTY UPDATES

- CDC Updated Safety Practices for Workers Exposed to COVID-19 On April 8, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued additional guidance to help ensure critical infrastructure workers can perform their jobs safely after potential exposure to COVID-19. Essential workers such as health care workers, can, under certain circumstances, go back to work, if they are asymptomatic and take the recommended actions of taking their temperature before they go to work, wearing a face mask at all times, and practicing social distancing when they are at work. - Change for Returning Cruise Ship Travelers CDC has <u>updated its recommendations</u> to help US cruise ship travelers (passengers and crew) get home as quickly and safely as possible during the COVID-19 pandemic. In summary, CDC recommends that cruise ship travelers with no symptoms or mild symptoms disembark as quickly and safely as possible at US ports of entry. Cruise line companies must get travelers directly to their homes via chartered or private transportation; commercial flights and public transportation may not be used. As of April 7, the U.S. Coast Guard facilitated the disembarkation of 100 passengers and 881 crew members from one cruise ship in Florida.
- LA County Considers Rent Assistance Program Los Angeles County Supervisors Janice Hahn and Hilda Solis have proposed a COVID-19 Emergency Rent Assistance Program. The program would provide up to \$1,000 per month for three months to renters who have lost income due to the coronavirus pandemic. While the Board of Supervisors implemented a rent freeze and eviction moratorium to prevent families from losing their homes, renters will still need to pay back rent owed after the crisis is over. Rent assistance through the proposed program would not need to be paid back. Funding would come from the second round of contributions Los Angeles County expects to receive from the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), philanthropy, and private sources. The Emergency

Rent Assistance Program proposal will be voted on at the March 14, 2020 virtual Board of Supervisors meeting.
