COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT APRIL 12, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Keep Roundhouse Fish Swimming The Manhattan Beach Pier is closed, but the fish at the Roundhouse Aquarium Teaching Center are still swimming happily. Do you remember kissing a sea cucumber for seven years of good luck or touching a sea star? Click here to take a tour of the Roundhouse and remind you of our iconic Aquarium. While the Aquarium is closed to public access, the Roundhouse aquarist team cares and feeds the marine life daily. Help us keep the fish swimming!
- Social Distancing and Face Coverings at Essential Businesses In this difficult time for our business community, it is imperative that we continue to prioritize our health and follow social distancing requirements. As required by the City's Ordinance and County/State Public Health Orders, essential businesses must enforce social distancing by requiring all persons to be separated by at least six feet from others (to the extent feasible) and wear face coverings (beginning on April 15). These measures are not taken lightly and if we all do our part, residents and businesses, it will allow us to be healthier and stronger as we continue to 'flatten the curve!'

FEDERAL, STATE AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Project Airbridge Increases Medical Supplies The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) enlisted the help of the private sector to deliver needed supplies expediting the process from weeks to days. FEMA established Project Airbridge and the COVID-19 Supply Chain Task Force to shorten the amount of time it takes for U.S. medical supply distributors to get commercially pre-sourced and procured personal protective equipment and other critical supplies into the country. As of April 11, Project Airbridge has completed 28 flights with an additional 28 scheduled.
- DOD Deployed Medical Assistance As of April 11, the Department of Defense has deployed more than 320 medical area personnel from the United States Navy and the United States Air Force to support New York City and Philadelphia hospitals.
- Ventilator Production Under Defense Production Act This week, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services signed two ventilator production contracts under the Defense Production Act, with <u>General Motors (GM)</u> and <u>Philips</u>. Both contract are expected to result in the delivery of a total of 73,000 ventilators to Strategic National Stockpile. By June 1, approximately 8,632 ventilators will be delivered to the Stockpile.
- Latest COVIDView Surveillance Report The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) launched <u>COVIDView</u>, during week 13 of the pandemic. The latest

report summarizes and interprets key indicators including, information related to COVID-19 outpatient visits, emergency department visits, hospitalizations, and deaths, as well as laboratory data.
