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# COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT APRIL 20, 2020

#### CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Celebrate Earth Week This week, the City of Manhattan Beach will celebrate the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Earth Day, Wednesday, April 22 all week long! - Please Pick Up After Your Pet The City has decided to temporarily suspend refilling the dog waste bags on Veterans Parkway during the length of the safer-at-home public health orders. Studies have indicated that COVID-19 may live a long time on metal. Therefore, to eliminate any unnecessary or potential exposure on the dispensers, the City will not be refilling the dispensers. That being said, as a reminder, it is the pet owner's responsibility to have in their possession, a bag, wrapper, or other container to dispose of their pet's waste in a sanitary manner. Various dog waste bag alternatives are available at any supermarket and the community is encouraged to buy those during this time.
- City Council to Discuss Additional Measures to Address COVID-19 The next City Council meeting takes place, Wednesday, April 22, at 8:00 AM. Additional measures for consideration include requiring face coverings in public. Meetings are broadcast live through Manhattan Beach Local Community Cable, Channel 8 (Spectrum), Channel 35 (Frontier), and live streaming via the City's website. In the interest of maintaining appropriate social distancing, the City Council encourages the public to participate by using one of the following options for public comments:
  - eComment Online, you can submit your eComments by 7:30 AM, the day of the meeting and have your comment available to City Council and the public;
  - o Email your public comment to <u>City Clerk</u> by 7:30 AM, the day of the meeting and have your comment available to City Council and the public; or
  - o Call (310) 802-5030 and leave a message by 7:30 AM, the day of the meeting.

- Antibody Tests Study Reveal Potential COVID-19 Exposure in LA County USC and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health today released preliminary results from a collaborative scientific study that suggests infections from COVID-19 are far more widespread and the fatality rate much lower in LA County than previously thought. The press release states, "Based on results of the first round of testing, the research team estimates that approximately 4.1% of the county's adult population has antibody to the virus. Adjusting this estimate for statistical margin of error implies about 2.8% to 5.6% of the county's adult population has antibody to the virus- which translates to approximately 221,000 to 442,000 adults in the county who have had the infection." - New Small Business Grant Opens Today The Los Angeles Area Chamber of Commerce announced a new Small Business grant application from the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation that went online today. The Foundation set up a new Save Small Business Fund to provide \$5,000 in short-term relief to businesses that have between three and 20 employees. For more information, go to savesmallbusiness.com.
- Same Day COVID-19 Tests Available <u>Same-day tests</u> and more drive-up mobile locations are available for all LA County residents who have symptoms of COVID-19. Insurance is not required, but appointments are. For more information, go to <u>covid19.lacounty.gov</u>.
- Relief Grant for Artists The Los Angeles Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA) announced
  an emergency relief grant available to artists and ensembles whose shows or concerts that
  were within the City of Los Angeles have been canceled due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

- Disaster Help Center The Los Angeles County <u>Department of Consumer and Business</u>
   Affairs has partnered with the <u>Department of Workforce</u>, <u>Development</u>, <u>Aging</u>, and <u>Community Services</u> and other County and State agencies to form the <u>LA County Disaster Help Center</u>. The Center has resources ready to assist businesses, workers, non-profits, tenants/landlords and more impacted by the disaster of COVID-19 by calling (833) 238-4450 or visiting <u>LACountyHelpCenter.org</u>.
- COVID-19 LA County Daily Briefing Statistics The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health confirmed 17 new deaths and 1,491 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. It is important to note that, 1,191 of these cases are from a backlog of tests received from one lab, and 293 are daily reported cases. In LA County, the total number of deaths attributed to COVID-19 is doubling every seven days. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 80,500 individuals. As of today, 3,465 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (25% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness. Thus far, 13% of those tested were positive for COVID-19.
