# COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT APRIL 23, 2020

#### CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Planning Commission Meeting April 29, at 3:00 PM The next Planning Commission Meeting takes place, Wednesday, April 29, at 3:00 PM. This is a rescheduled, regular meeting of the Planning Commission from April 22, 2020. Pursuant to Governor Newsom's Executive Order Nos. N-25-20 and N-29-20, City Council Chambers will not be open to the public, members of the Planning Commission, staff, and public, may participate in this meeting via remote methods. In the interest of maintaining appropriate social distancing, the Planning Commission encourages the public to participate remotely during the meeting. If you are unable to attend the meeting via Zoom and wish to comment on agenda items or other subject matters within the jurisdiction of the Planning Commission, please do the following: Submit comments via email or call (310) 802-5512 and leave a message, before 2:00 PM on April 29.
- Partial Trial Opening of Polliwog Park The City Council has directed a partial reopening of Polliwog Park on a trial basis. All those entering the park must wear face coverings while visiting the park. The park reopening will be effective Saturday, April 25, at 6:30 AM, and will be monitored and evaluated for compliance. The park may be closed again in the event the rules are not observed by the public. As the health of the community remains a top priority, amenities such as restrooms, playgrounds, fitness equipment, sports field, the dog run, picnic pads, Manhattan Beach Historical House, Begg Pool and parking lot, and the Botanical Garden will not be accessible and remain closed. As required by the City Council and City Emergency Order No. 4, all persons must wear face coverings while visiting the park. Further, all park visitors must continue to abide by the City's and Los Angeles County Public Health Orders to remain six fix apart from others not in their household. Park staff will patrol Polliwog Park to remind park visitors that face coverings and social distancing are mandated; violators are subject to a fine.

Foreclosure Prevention Services - The Department of Consumer and Business Affairs

- Bring an Adopt-a-Pet Home While Fees Are Free The Los Angeles County Department of Animal Care and Control (DACC) is currently waiving adoption fees for all animals at the animal care centers in an effort to quickly place animals in homes during the COVID-19 crisis. Because people are adhering to the Safer at Home requirements, many can devote time to a new pet. The fee waived adoptions are possible thanks to a grant DACC received from the Petco Foundation. An appointment is necessary to visit a local care center; go to animalcare.lacounty.gov for more information.
- CARES Act Benefits College and University Students The U.S Department of Education
   announced more than \$6 billion from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security
   (CARES) Act will be distributed to colleges and universities to provide direct emergency cash
   grants to college students whose lives and educations have been disrupted by the
   coronavirus outbreak. This is in addition to the \$6.28 billion in funding for institutions to cover
   costs associated with significant changes to the delivery of instruction due to COVID-19. For

- LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has confirmed 68 new deaths and 1,081 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 99,000 individuals. As of today, 4,053 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (24% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness. Thus far, 14% of those tested were positive for COVID-19.
