COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT APRIL 24, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- City Making Preparations for Warm Weekend In advance of the warm weather weekend, the City has been making preparations to ensure City and County Public Health Orders are abided by. The City has deployed 8 portable changeable message signs throughout City reminding the public that the beach is closed, planned additional police patrols, deployed staff on Ocean Drive, Veterans Parkway (i.e. Greenbelt), and Polliwog Park, and developed signage with messaging informing the public of requirements. Take all necessary measures to stay cool, but please do so responsibly and remember, #StayHomeMB!
- Support Local Businesses Responsibly The City Manager issued Emergency Order No. 5 requiring establishments serving food and alcohol for takeout, to transfer alcohol purchases to customers only at the same time food is transferred to the customer. The goal of the order is to prevent the consumption of alcohol by customers while waiting for the preparation of food pick-up, and to prevent gathering opportunities for customers at or around restaurants. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the State Alcohol Beverage Control Department (ABC) has allowed restaurants and similar establishments to sell alcohol for off-site consumption "when sold in conjunction with meals prepared for pick-up or delivery." However, pursuant to state and local laws, no one is allowed to open or consume alcohol in public.
- Partial Trial Opening of Polliwog Park The City Council has directed a partial reopening
 of Polliwog Park on a trial basis. All those entering the park must wear face coverings while
 visiting the park. The park reopening will be effective Saturday, April 25, at 6:30 AM, and will
 be monitored and evaluated for compliance.
- Happy Ramadan Ramadan has begun, and we want to wish a Happy Ramadan to our Muslim friends and neighbors who are observing. Please continue to connect to your faith community, friends and extended family from afar. Thank you for all that you are doing to slow the spread.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

• COVID-19 Grant to Benefit Firefighters - On April 23, FEMA announced an additional \$100 million in funding for the <u>Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program</u>. This supplemental funding will provide financial assistance directly to eligible fire departments, non-affiliated

- emergency medical service organizations and State Fire Training Academies for critical PPE and supplies needed to respond to COVID-19.
- Coronavirus Treatment Acceleration Program The U.S. Food and Drug Administration
 (FCA) published a <u>blog</u> on the <u>Coronavirus Treatment Acceleration Program</u>. The program
 uses every available method to move new treatments to patients as quickly as possible,
 while at the same time finding out whether the treatments are helpful or harmful. Visit

- COVID-19 State Orders Governor Newsom approved several executive orders benefiting the following:
 - Student Loan Relief Provide options that include: allowing a minimum of 90 days forbearance, waiving late payment fees, ensuring that no borrower is subject to negative credit reporting, and helping eligible borrowers enroll in other assistance programs;
 - School Districts Requires publishing a written report to the community that explains how they have responded to COVID-19, including steps taken to deliver distance learning and meet the needs of disadvantaged students;
 - Medi-Cal Providers Temporarily suspends requirements for in-person signatures for patients to obtain certain prescriptions covered by Medi-Cal and allows 90-day extensions for providers;
 - Department of Motor Vehicle Provide 60-day extensions for customers with expired drivers' licenses and identification cards and suspends late fees from being applied to expired vehicle registrations;
 - o <u>California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)</u> Allows public access involvement through electronic means consistent with COVID-19 public health concerns; and
 - o <u>Grocery Bags</u> Temporarily allows retailers, particularly grocery stores, to provide bags to consumers without charge to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.
- County Considers Vote-By-Mail in November LA County Supervisors Hahn and Kuehl
 have proposed sending a Vote-by-Mail ballot to every eligible LA County voter in all
 elections starting with the November 3, 2020 General Election in an ongoing effort to slow
 the spread of COVID-19. The proposal, will be voted on during the Tuesday, April 28, Board
 of Supervisors meeting. Visit bos.lacounty.gov for more information.
- LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has confirmed 52 new deaths and 1,035 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 108,000 individuals. As of today, 4,211 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (24% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness. Thus far, 15% of those tested were positive for COVID-19.
