COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT APRIL 25, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- City Council to Consider Reopening Farmers Market At the April 27, 2020, meeting, the
 City Council will consider the Farmers Market proposal to reopen on a limited basis with
 restrictions. View the <u>full agenda with attachments on the City's website</u>. In the interest of
 maintaining appropriate social distancing, the City Council encourages the public to
 participate by using one of the following options for public comments:
 - eComment Online, you can submit your eComments by 7:30 AM, the day of the meeting and have your comment available to City Council and the public;
 - o Email your public comment to <u>City Clerk</u> by 7:30 AM, the day of the meeting and have your comment available to City Council and the public; or
 - o Call (310) 802-5030 and leave a message by 7:30 AM, the day of the meeting.
- Support Local Businesses Responsibly The City Manager issued Emergency Order No. 5 requiring establishments serving food and alcohol for takeout, to transfer alcohol purchases to customers only at the same time food is transferred to the customer. The goal of the order is to prevent the consumption of alcohol by customers while waiting for the preparation of food pick-up, and to prevent gathering opportunities for customers at or around restaurants. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the State Alcohol Beverage Control Department (ABC) has allowed restaurants and similar establishments to sell alcohol for off-site consumption "when sold in conjunction with meals prepared for pick-up or delivery." However, pursuant to state and local laws, no one is allowed to open or consume alcohol in public.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Federal Interim Stimulus Bill Passes The United States Congress has passed a \$484 billion interim coronavirus funding bill that will replenish the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), (the stimulus bill's emergency loan program for small businesses), provide billions for hospitals and expand coronavirus testing. Per Governor Newsom, the bill will further provide critical support for millions of Californians to continue fighting COVID-19 and the economic effects of the pandemic.
- Benefits for Older Adults and People with Disabilities The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced \$955 million in Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act grants for Community Living to support older adults and people with

disabilities during the COVID-19 emergency. This will fund home-delivered meals, care services in the home, respite care and other support to families and caregivers, and other support services. The need for these services has increased as community measures to slow transmission of COVID-19 have closed locations where many people typically receive services and made it difficult for families to assist loved ones who live alone. - Telehealth Benefits Everyone HHS launched <u>Telehealth.hhs.gov</u> as a central source of information on telehealth resources and tools for patients and providers. In the U.S. Surgeon General's blog post "<u>Health Providers: Join the Telehealth Revolution</u>," he highlights how working safely at home, telehealth allows clinicians to perform virtual visits, refill and adjust essential medications, and modify treatments that will preserve and improve conditions that if left untreated, put patients at risk.
- COVID-19 Support for Pregnant Women and Mothers LA County has several programs and services such as Home Visiting Programs, Doula Services, and California Women, Infant and Children Program, that can help pregnant women, mothers, and families who have been affected by recent events. - LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has confirmed 48 new deaths and 607 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 114,000 individuals. As of today, 4,319 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (23% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness. Thus far, 15% of those tested were positive for COVID-19.
