- Warning to Bicyclists With the bike path closed along the Beach, Ocean Drive and many Manhattan Beach streets are being shared with avid cyclists. As a reminder, bicycles shall be operated with regard to the safety of self and others upon the streets and sidewalks, see <a href="Manhattan Beach Municipal Code 3.01.090">Manhattan Beach Municipal Code 3.01.090</a>. Cyclists must adhere to the rules of the road, including stopping at stop signs. No matter how you roll, slow your roll and remember to stay 6 feet apart!

### FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

WHO Questions Re-Infections – The World Health Organization (WHO) published a
 scientific brief that there currently is no evidence that people who recovered from COVID-19
 and have antibodies are protected from a second infection of COVID-19. Laboratory tests

that detect antibodies to SARS-CoV-2 in people, including rapid immunodiagnostic tests, need further validation to determine their accuracy and reliability. For more information, visit who, int.

- CARES Act Benefits Behavioral Health The <u>Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services</u>
   Administration (SAMHSA) announced grants have been awarded to increase access to and
   improve the quality of community mental and substance use disorder treatment services
   through the expansion of Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CCBHC). The
   organizations receiving the grant awards are listed at <u>samhsa.gov</u>.
- COVID-19 Master Question List The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) published the Master Question List (MQL) for COVID-19. The MLQ is intended to quickly present available information to decision makers in the operational response to COVID-19 and allow structured and scientifically guided discussions across the federal government, prevent duplication of efforts, and highlight and coordinate research. - COVID-19 Uninsured Program Portal The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services
  (HHS), through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), <u>launched the new Uninsured Program Portal</u>, allowing health care providers who provided tests or treatment for uninsured COVID-19 individuals request claim reimbursements.
- Reopening of National Parks The <u>U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI) and National Park Service announced</u> the coordination with governors across the country to reopen the national parks. Visit <u>doi.gov</u> for more information.
- LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has confirmed 29 new deaths and 900 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 124,000 individuals. As of today, 4,403 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (23% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness. Thus far, 14% of those tested were positive for COVID-19.
