CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- City Council to Consider Reopening Parks in Manhattan Beach At the May 5, meeting at 6:00 PM meeting, City Council will consider a parks reopening plan. View the <u>full agenda</u> with attachments on the City's website. Pursuant to Governor Newsom's Executive Orders No. N-25-20 and No. N-29-20, the City Council Chambers is not open to the public. However the public may view the City Council Meeting through Manhattan Beach Local Community Cable (Channel 8 on Spectrum and Channel 35 Frontier), and <u>live streamed</u> via the City's website. In the interest of maintaining appropriate social distancing, the City Council encourages the public to participate by using one of the following options to submit public comments on the City's Website.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Opening America's Workplace National Online Dialogue The U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) continues its efforts to support American workers and position the economy for a strong rebound. The USDOL is hosting a national online dialogue to solicit ideas about challenges that may be faced as businesses reopen and how best to help employers and workers reopen America's workplaces safely. They want to hear from America's employers and workers. Going on now through May 7, share your feedback and best ideas about (1) reopening businesses, (2) commuting safely, (3) working safely, (4) accommodating members of vulnerable populations, (5) supporting America's families, and (6) reducing regulatory burdens. Registration is required, visit ideascale by May 7 to participate.
- Payment Protection Program Comes Back On Monday, the <u>Small Business Administration</u> relaunched the Paycheck Protection Program after <u>distributing \$350 billion in loans to 1.6</u> million <u>businesses</u> earlier this month. Including last week's funding bill, more than \$670 billion is available for the loan program in total. For more information, visit <u>sba.gov</u>.
- FDA's Position on Remdesivir and Convalescent Plasma The <u>U.S. Food and Drug</u>
 <u>Administration</u> allows for Remdesivir to be distributed in the U.S. and administered by health
 care providers, as appropriate, to treat suspected or laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 in
 adults and children hospitalized with severe disease. FDA also provided recommendations

- to health care providers on investigational convalescent plasma collected from individuals who have recovered from COVID-19. For more information, visit fda.gov.
- Public Assistance to Benefit Children Governor Newsom signed an executive order that
 temporarily broadens the capability of counties to enroll persons into the <u>California Work</u>
 <u>Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids</u> (CalWORKs) program using various eligibility
 verification methods due to social distancing requirements. CalWORKs is a public assistance
 program that provides cash aid and services to eligible families that have a child or children

- Safer at Home Impacts for Businesses The Los Angeles County Department of Public
 Health is calling on all businesses to help Los Angeles County slow the spread of the disease
 caused by COVID-19. Previously, Public Health published the guide "Safer at Home" Order
 Impacts for Individuals. This week, Public Health published the guide "Safer at Home" Order
 Impacts for Businesses. As an owner, employer, employee, or customer, the guides, Social
 Distancing, and the Social Distancing Protocol are good references and for now,

- LA County Allocates \$3 Million to Regional Food Bank An estimated 2 million residents in the County experience food insecurity on an ongoing basis more than any county in the nation. LA County announced a \$3 million allocation to the Food Bank, a partner in the County effort to connect communities and families with needed resources during the COVID-19 crisis. - Coast Guard Monitor Vessels that Pose Risk to Public Health To date, the <u>U.S. Coast Guard (USCG)</u> has facilitated the discharge of over 265,000 passengers from over 125 cruise ships. Recently, USCG offloaded 119 passengers aboard the Pacific Princess cruise ship in Los Angeles and 103 crew members aboard the Grand Princess cruise ship in San Francisco. The passengers and crew were allowed to disembark from the ships after it was determined they were not infected with COVID-19 or other infectious diseases.
- LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has confirmed 62 new deaths and 1,065 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,209 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 158,000 individuals. As of today, 4,956 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (21% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness. Thus far, 14% of those tested were positive for COVID-19.
