CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Draft Park Re-Opening Plan to be Considered by City Council In accordance with City Council direction, Staff has developed a Parks Re-Opening Plan in advance of tomorrow's May 5, City Council meeting taking place at 6:00 PM. FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Update on State's Progress Toward Stage 2 Reopening Governor Newson released a State Report Card today showing how the state has made progress in fighting COVID-19 in a number of categories such as stabilized hospitalization, ICU numbers and acquiring PPE. In his presentation, he indicates California will be prepared to move into the early phase of Stage 2 of reopening this Friday, May 8. Business sectors will need to meet the guidelines provided by the state to safely reopen. Later this week, the state will release further guidance. California Department of Public Health Director and state Public Health Officer Dr. Sonia Angell presented on the state's Report Card to underscore the data driving the move into the next stage. - Wildfire Preparedness Week Governor Newsom issued a proclamation for Wildfire Preparedness Week. Over the last three years, California has experienced the deadliest and the most destructive fires in state history. While everyone is safer at home, prepare to prevent loss of life and property. Take steps to ensure there is adequate and defensible space around your home and take time to practice your fire evacuation plan with your family. - Incoming PPE Shipment to Nursing Home The Federal Emergency Management Agency
 (FEMA) is coordinating shipments of personal protective equipment (PPE) to nursing homes
 across the nation to where there is a critical need; some of our country's most vulnerable
 residents combating COVID-19 live in nursing homes. The shipment of PPE includes surgical
 masks, gloves, goggles, and other eye protection, and gowns.
- U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Extension The U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) is providing flexibility to individuals and employers. Applicants and petitioners now have an additional 60 calendar days after the deadline listed in agency requests, notices, or decisions dated between March 1 and July 1 to respond before USCIS takes any action. - Coastal Patrols Combat COVID-19 The <u>U.S. Customs and Border Protection</u> are strengthening its presence along California's coastline to combat against human and drug trafficking. This effort concurrently prevents any further introduction of COVID-19 into California communities. See <u>cbp.gov</u> for more information.
- Beware of Fraudulent and Unapproved Pharmaceuticals The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in coordination with the Office of Private Sector (OPS), warned of threats to health care patients caused by fraudulent or unapproved pharmaceuticals. Buying drugs from other than sources approved and regulated by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is dangerous. Consumers can avoid fraudulent and unapproved pharmaceuticals by considering the following recommendations when purchasing prescription drugs:
 - 1. Purchase prescription medications from state-licensed pharmacies.
 - 2. Purchase drugs authorized by a licensed physician, which address a valid medical need, and are based on legitimate interactions with a medical doctor.
 - 3. Purchase prescribed medications from providers in the United States with a verifiable physical address.
 - 4. Avoid online pharmacies selling prescription drugs without requiring a valid prescription.
 - 5. Avoid any drug purporting to cure or treat cancer or eliminate malignant tumors, including claims to negate the necessity of conventional cancer treatments.

• LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 - The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has confirmed 28 new deaths and 568 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,256 deaths; ninety-three percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 173,000 individuals and 13% of people testing positive. As of today, 5,019 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (19% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness.
