COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT MAY 7, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- City Required to Follow State and County Recovery Requirements The State of California and County of Los Angeles have begun to lay out a framework to adjust the Public Health Orders that allows businesses, organizations, facilities and public spaces to reopen in a safe manner. While the City is looking forward to when the State and County reopen our local economy, the City cannot adopt any public health measures that conflict with the baseline of regulations required by the County or State. The City can only be more restrictive, where appropriate. Therefore, the City must continue to follow the County Department of Public Health's regulations and guidelines on how to reopen. As the City receives guidance from County and State officials, the City will continue to communicate that information to the public.
- Manhattan Beach Unified School District Closure for the Remainder of the School Year -The School District has extended its school closure "for the remainder of the school year," according to a decision by the MBUSD school board last night. The board members agreed that it would essentially be impossible to reopen the schools given the current recommendations on social distancing and safety requirements. Graduation plans for Mira Costa seniors are still uncertain, a socially distant or virtual event could be possible as late as August.
- Grants for Local Small Business Owners Available Local Love for Manhattan Beach (LLMB) has been launched by longtime residents, Jeff and Peir Serota, to support local small businesses in the City who are suffering under the mandated COVID-19 lockdown. By partnering with one 2 one USA Foundation, a 50lc(3) organization, \$5,000 \$20,000 grant amounts will be awarded in order to make a meaningful difference in the lives of the recipients. The fund is currently over \$200,000 thanks in part to help from the Manhattan Beach Chamber of Commerce and the Manhattan Beach Rotary Club. FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

Reopening Retail and Manufacturing Sectors – Governor Newsom released updated
 Industry Guidance to help drive reopening for some sectors including retail, manufacturing
 and logistics with modifications, beginning Friday, May 8, with regional variance which allows
 for counties to move further into Stage 2 when they attest to meet certain criteria that reduce
 risk and establish a safer environment for workers and customers. Please see the state's Retail

<u>Guide</u> and <u>Retail Checklist</u> for safety protocols to be implemented with re-opening. The <u>Resilience Roadmap</u> stages that California is using to guide its gradual reopening process are:

- Stage 1: Safety and Preparedness
- o Stage 2: Lower-Risk Workplaces
- o Stage 3: Higher-Risk Workplaces
- o Stage 4: End of Stay at Home Order

When modifications are advanced and the state's <u>six indicators</u> show enough progress, the state can move to the next stage of the roadmap. The State is indicating we are now moving into Stage 2, where some lower-risk workplaces can gradually open with adaptations. However, these may vary by region and may not be **applicable to Los Angeles County at this time**. See <u>ca.gov</u> for more information.

- Additional Testing Sites The state is rolling out 80 additional testing sites focused on
 underserved communities and Los Angeles County is launching more 8 testing sites. Testing
 continues to be by appointment only. Anyone can <u>sign up and register</u>, regardless of
 insurance or immigration status; there is no fee for a test.
- New Eligibility for Economic Injury Disaster Loan and Advance The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) will begin accepting new Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) and EIDL Advance applications on a limited basis only to provide relief to U.S. agricultural businesses. To learn more about eligibility and apply, visit sba.gov. EIDL applicants who have already submitted their applications will continue to be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. In addition to traditional SBA funding programs, the CARES Act established several temporary programs to address the COVID-19 outbreak; for programs available for your business visit sba.gov.
- Los Angeles County Golf Courses and Trails Reopen May 9 Based on Stage 2 of the reopening plan, LA County Parks has modified its operations to begin the multi-phased approach to public access of golf courses and trails on Saturday, May 9. While the golf courses and trails will reopen, there are specific restrictions and safety guidelines that the public must follow in accordance with the Public Health Order. - LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 LA County Public Health (Public Health) has confirmed 51 new deaths and 815 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,418 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 208,000 individuals and 12% of people testing positive. As of today, 5,238 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (19% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness.
