RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the accompanying Resolution confirming the Director of Emergency Services Orders issued during the Local Emergency proclaimed to address COVID-19.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

There is no impact to the General Fund from adopting this Resolution confirming these Director of Emergency Services Orders. There will be costs in staff resources for the implementation and enforcement of the Orders.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

Pursuant to Manhattan Beach Municipal Code Chapter 3.08, the City Manager serves as the Director of Emergency for the City of Manhattan Beach. Due to the threat to the public health and safety of persons and property in the City of Manhattan Beach caused by the global spread of the Coronavirus ("COVID-19") pandemic, the City Council proclaimed the existence of a local emergency on March 13, 2020. On March 17, 2020, the City Council ratified this proclamation of a local emergency.

In the event of a proclamation of a local emergency, Manhattan Beach Municipal Code Section 3.08.060.A.6.a empowers the Director of Emergency Services to make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by such emergency, so long as such rules and regulations are "confirmed at the earliest practicable time" by the City Council. Pursuant to this authority, the Director of Emergency Services issued

a series of emergency orders intended to reduce the spread of COVID-19 by – among other things – closing certain City spaces and regulating various activities deemed "essential" by the applicable state and county public health orders and guidelines. These emergency orders, which are described in further detail in the recitals to the accompanying Resolution, must be confirmed by the City Council "at the earliest practicable time" to remain in effect.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MANHATTAN BEACH CITY COUNCIL CONFIRMING THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES ORDERS ISSUED DURING THE LOCAL EMERGENCY PROCLAIMED TO ADDRESS COVID-19

WHEREAS, international, national, state, and local health and governmental authorities are responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus named "SARS-CoV-2," and the disease it causes has been named "coronavirus disease 2019," abbreviated COVID-19 ("COVID-19");

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, the Governor of the State of California declared a state of emergency to make additional resources available, formalize emergency actions already underway across multiple state agencies and departments, and help the state prepare for broader spread of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America declared a national emergency and announced that the federal government would make emergency funding available to assist state and local governments in preventing the spread of and addressing the effects of COVID-19:

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 20-0039, A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Manhattan Beach Proclaiming the Existence of a Local Emergency;

WHEREAS, the City Manager is the Director of Emergency Services in the City of Manhattan Beach. Pursuant to Manhattan Beach Municipal Section 3.08.060.A.6.a, the City Manager as the Director of Emergency Services is empowered during a local emergency to make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by such emergency, so long as such rules and regulations are "confirmed at the earliest practicable time" by the City Council;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services ordered the closure of City governmental structures and facilities such as Manhattan Beach City Hall, Joslyn Community Center, Manhattan Heights Community Center, Scout House, and the City Public Works Yard;

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued the Safer at Home Order for Control of COVID-19, which was subsequently amended and revised (the "County Safer at Home Order"). The County Safer at Home Order was initially effective until March 31, 2020;

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the City Council ratified Resolution No. 20-0039;

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 20-0013-U which, among other things, adopted by reference the County Order, imposed regulations regarding social distancing, and recommended additional social distancing practices;

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services ordered the closure of Manhattan Beach Pier and all City parks, fields, sports courts, exercise equipment, and other recreational facilities;

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the Governor of the State of California issued Executive Order N-33-20, directing all residents of the State of California to heed directives issued by the State Health Officer on the same date instructing all Californians to stay home except as needed to maintain continuity of operations of the federal critical infrastructure sectors (the "State Stay at Home Order");

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services ordered the closure of the parking lots located at El Porto, Bruce's Beach, and the Manhattan Beach Pier, except for City residents who possess valid and current residential parking permits for the relevant lots;

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 20-0014-U which, among other things, required all persons and businesses to comply with health and safety measures required by a state or county order related to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued a Health Officer Order closing, among other things, all County beaches;

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 20-0015-U which, among other things, amended Ordinance No. 20-0014-U to clarify that all persons and businesses must also comply with health and safety measures required by state or county guidelines related to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services ordered the closure of the beach walking path known as the Strand in conjunction with the County's closure of the adjacent County beaches;

WHEREAS, on April 3, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services issued Emergency Order No. 1, which is attached herein at Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference, to require COVID-19 safety measures at construction sites;

WHEREAS, on April 8, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services issued Emergency Order No. 2, which is attached herein at Exhibit "B" and incorporated by reference, to memorialize the closures of certain City spaces, parks, and facilities that he initially ordered on March 19, 2020, March 24, 2020, and March 27, 2020;

WHEREAS, on April 10, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health extended the County Safer at Home Order until May 15, 2020;

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services issued Emergency Order No. 3, which is attached herein at Exhibit "C" and incorporated by reference, to extend the closure of City governmental structures and facilities such as Manhattan Beach City Hall, Joslyn Community Center, Manhattan Heights Community Center, Scout House, and the City Public Works Yard until the later of May 15, 2020, or any subsequent applicable extensions, revisions, or amendments of the County Safer at Home Order;

WHEREAS, on April 22, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services issued Emergency Order No. 4, which is attached herein at Exhibit "D" and incorporated by reference, to partially reopen Polliwog Park on a trial basis, subject to the requirement that all park visitors must wear face coverings and practice social distancing;

WHEREAS, on April 24, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services issued Emergency Order No. 5, which is attached herein at Exhibit "E" and incorporated by reference, to prohibit restaurants, bars, nightclubs, and similar businesses from providing any alcohol to a customer prior to providing the meal prepared for delivery, pick-up, and drive-thru;

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services issued Emergency Order No. 6, which is attached herein at Exhibit "F" and incorporated by reference, to amend Emergency Order No. 4 by lifting the requirement that all visitors to Polliwog Park must wear face coverings;

WHEREAS, on May 8, 2020, the Director of Emergency Services issued Emergency Order No. 7, which is attached herein at Exhibit "G" and incorporated by reference, to partially reopen Live Oak and Sand Dune Parks.

WHEREAS, in the interest of the public health and safety, as affected by the emergency caused by the spread of COVID-19, it is necessary for the City Council to confirm Director of Emergency Services Orders issued during the local emergency proclaimed to address COVID-19 in accordance with Chapter 3.08 of the Manhattan Beach Municipal Code, Manhattan Beach City Council Resolution No. 20-0039, and the California Emergency Services Act, Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 8550) of Title 2 of the Government Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MANHATTAN BEACH CITY COUNCIL DOES HEREBY DECLARE, FIND, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by reference.

<u>Section 2</u>. The City Council hereby confirms the Director of Emergency Services Orders issued during the local emergency proclaimed to address COVID-19.

Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Resolution or the emergency orders confirmed herein is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution or the emergency orders. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Resolution and confirmed the emergency orders and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any portion of such Resolution or the emergency orders would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

<u>Section 4</u>. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution.

CITY OF MANHATTAN BEACH DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES ORDER NO. 1

REQUIRING COVID-19 MEASURES AT CONSTRUCTION SITES EFFECTIVE APRIL 4, 2020 AT 12:01 a.m.

Date of Order: April 3, 2020

WHEREAS, international, national, state, and local health and governmental authorities are responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus named "SARS-CoV-2," and the disease it causes has been named "coronavirus disease 2019," abbreviated COVID-19, ("COVID-19");

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, the Governor of the State of California declared a state of emergency to make additional resources available, formalize emergency actions already underway across multiple state agencies and departments, and help the state prepare for broader spread of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America declared a national emergency and announced that the federal government would make emergency funding available to assist state and local governments in preventing the spread of and addressing the effects of COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 20-0039, A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Manhattan Beach Proclaiming the Existence of a Local Emergency;

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the City Council ratified Resolution No. 20-0039;

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 20-0013-U and Advisory Resolution No. 20-0040 which, *inter alia*, adopted by reference the County Order, imposed regulations regarding social distancing, and recommended additional social distancing practices;

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the Governor of the State of California issued Executive Order N-33-20, directing all residents of the State of California to heed directives issued by the State Health Officer on the same date instructing all Californians to stay home except as needed to maintain continuity of operations of the federal critical infrastructure sectors (the "State Stay at Home Order");

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued an enhanced Health Officer Order, the Safer at Home Order for Control of COVID-19, amending and superseding its March 16, 2020 Order, closing all nonessential businesses, and limiting gatherings to 9 people or less;

WHEREAS, on March 21, 2020, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued an enhanced Health Officer Order, the Safer at Home Order for Control of COVID-19, amending and superseding its March 16, 2020, and March 19, 2020 Orders, closing all nonessential businesses and prohibiting gatherings of non-household members;

WHEREAS, both the State Stay at Home Order and the County Department of Public Health's Safer at Home Order identify construction, operation, inspection and maintenance of construction sites and construction projects (including housing construction) as an essential business that may continue to operate under these orders;

WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 20-0014-U which, *inter alia*, required essential businesses, including construction businesses, to comply with health and safety measures required by a state or county order related to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 20-0015-U which, *inter alia*, amended Ordinance No. 20-0014-U to clarify that essential businesses, including construction businesses, must also comply with health and safety measures required by state or county guidelines related to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, the County Department of Public Health's Safer at Home Order directs all essential businesses, including construction businesses, to comply with all of the following: (a) enforce social distancing measures, requiring that individuals maintain separation of at least six (6) feet to the extent feasible; (b) provide access to hand washing facilities with soap and water or to hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol; (c) post a sign in a conspicuous place at all public entries that instructs members of the public to not enter if they are experiencing symptoms of respiratory illness, including fever or cough; and (d) adhere to communicable disease control recommendations provided by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, including guidance for cleaning and disinfecting the site;

WHEREAS, as of April 3, 2020, the Los Angeles County of Public Health has confirmed 4,566 cases of COVID-19 in Los Angeles County and that number is expected to continue to rise;

WHEREAS, the act and process of construction may necessitate workers to work together or assist each other within distances of less than the recommended social distancing of 6 feet;

WHEREAS, to ensure that construction workers at construction sites and projects are provided with the means to comply, and comply, to the maximum extent possible, with the County Department of Public Health's Safer at Home Order, it is necessary to put in place additional measures at construction sites to ensure compliance;

WHEREAS, the City Manager is the Director Emergency Services in the City of Manhattan Beach. Pursuant to Manhattan Beach Municipal Section 3.08.060.A.6.a, the City Manager as the Director of Emergency Services is empowered during a local emergency to "make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by such emergency", so long as such rules and regulations are "confirmed at the earliest practicable time" by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, in the interest of the public health and safety, as affected by the emergency caused by the spread of COVID-19, it is necessary to exercise my authority pursuant to Chapter 3.08 of the Manhattan Beach Municipal Code, Manhattan Beach City Council Resolution No. 20-0039, and the California Emergency Services Act, Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 8550) of Title 2 of the Government Code, to issue this order.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Order by reference.
- Section 2. The property owner and contractor (collectively the "Contractor") at any property within the City of Manhattan Beach at which construction work is occurring ("Construction Site") shall develop a comprehensive COVID-19 exposure control plan, which includes control measures such as social distancing, symptom checking, hygiene, decontamination procedures, and training ("Exposure Control Plan" or "Plan"). The Exposure Control Plan shall contain at a minimum the measures detailed in this Order and such measures must be followed to prevent any onsite worker from contracting COVID-19. Upon the City's request, the contractor shall submit the Plan to the City. Failure to comply with this Order shall be deemed as creating unsafe conditions and may result in withheld inspections or the closure of the Construction Site until corrected.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Contractor shall institute the following measures which shall be included in the Exposure Control Plan.
- A. The Contractor shall post at the Construction Site, in areas visible to all workers, required hygienic practices including: (i) not touching one's face with unwashed hands or with gloves; (ii) washing one's hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use of hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol; (iii) cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects and surfaces including shared tools and equipment; and (iv) covering one's mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing as well as other hygienic recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control ("CDC").
- B. The Contractor shall install hand washing facilities with soap and water or hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol in multiple locations at the Construction Site (including at each entrance to the Construction Site) and shall ensure that the facilities remain adequately stocked during all times of construction activity.
 - C. The Contractor shall not permit sharing of tools or equipment.
- D. The Contractor shall also establish a schedule for cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched objects and surfaces and maintain a log of the established cleaning schedule which shall be made available to the City upon request.
- E. The Contractor shall instruct its workers and other members of the public at the Construction Site to maintain social distancing to the greatest extent possible by maintaining a minimum 6-foot distance from one another at all times, except as specified in Subsection (F) below. The Contractor shall post a sign in a conspicuous place at each pedestrian entrance to the Construction Site as well as throughout the site instructing workers and other members of the public of this requirement.
- F. The Contractor or the owner, manager, or operator of any business that, as its primary operation, is engaged in construction work at the Construction Site shall ensure that its employees or independent contractors are provided personal protective equipment ("PPE")

such as gloves, goggles, face shields and face masks to comply with the provisions of this Order and as is appropriate for the activity being performed at the Construction Site. Workers needing close contact (less than 6-feet) in order to perform their work duties shall be required to wear Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) such as face masks, eye protection, and gloves.

- G. The Contractor shall instruct its workers and other members of the public at the Construction Site against gathering in groups of any size, including gathering on site for lunch and other breaks. The Contractor shall ensure that, anytime two or more people must meet, such persons maintain a distance of six feet from one another at all times.
- H. The Contractor shall: (i) identify "choke points" and "high-risk areas" where workers are forced to stand together, such as hallways, hoists and elevators, break areas, and buses, and control them so that social distancing of six feet from one another is maintained; (ii) minimize interactions when picking up or delivering equipment or materials so that social distancing of six feet from one another is maintained; and (iii) stagger the trades as necessary to reduce density so that social distancing of six feet from one another is maintained.
- I. For sites with more than 4 workers, the Contractor shall designate a person as the Construction Site COVID-19 Supervisor to enforce this Order. The designated COVID-19 Supervisor shall be present on the Construction Site at all times during construction activities. The COVID-19 Supervisor can be an on-site worker who is designated to carry this role.
- J. The Contractor shall prohibit anyone entering the Construction Site if they are experiencing signs of illness, including respiratory illness, fever or cough or if the contractor knows or has reason to know such person has been in recent close contact with someone with laboratory confirmed COVID-19. The Contractor shall also require anyone working or visiting the Construction Site to return home if such person is experiencing signs of illness, including respiratory illness, fever or cough. The Contractor shall post a sign in a conspicuous place at each pedestrian entrance to the Construction Site instructing workers and other members of the public of these requirements.
- K. The Contractor shall require anyone working at the Construction Site to stay home if they are sick, except to obtain medical care.
- L. The Contractor shall require anyone working at the Construction Site to inform their supervisor if they have been exposed to COVID-19 or has a sick family member or other person at home with COVID-19.
- M. The Contractor shall take all appropriate steps, if individuals are residing at the Construction Site, to ensure that workers minimize their contact with areas within the building but not within the actual construction project, including limiting workers' path of travel in and out of the project site, and, for all such areas with which contact is unavoidable, regularly clean and sanitize those areas at least twice daily, including following completion of work each day, and maintain a log of the cleaning schedule to be made available to the City upon request.
- N. The Contractor shall maintain a daily attendance log of all workers and visitors.

Section 4. The property owner of the Construction Site and their contractor(s) are legally responsible for compliance with this Order. Manhattan Beach staff will verify compliance with this Order during regular scheduled inspections for projects under construction as well as in response to complaints that may be submitted to the City by email to code@citymb.info. This Order authorizes the City's building official or designee to issue a stop work order at a Construction Site at which workers are in violation of Sections 2 and 3 of this Order by giving notice in writing to the COVID-19 Supervisor, the Contractor or to persons engaged in the doing or causing such work to be done at the Construction Site. No person shall fail to comply with such a stop work order if issued by the City.

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America declared a national emergency and announced that the federal government would make emergency funding available to assist state and local governments in preventing the spread of and addressing the effects of COVID-19;

 - 1. Only the green spaces within Polliwog Park are reopened.
 - All other sections of Polliwog Park including but not limited to all restrooms, courts, sports fields, picnic pads, playground equipment, and dog runs – remain closed.
- B. Prior to entering Polliwog Park, all persons shall wear a face covering that covers the nose and mouth and wear such face covering at all times within the Park.
- C. The social distancing requirements set forth in Ordinance Nos. 20-0014-U and 20-0015-U are still valid.
- D. Please note that the County of Los Angeles has issued guidance for cloth face coverings at this link http://publichealth.lacounty.gov/media/Coronavirus/GuidanceClothFaceCoverings.pdf including the following guidance with respect to children:

"ABC"), including the requirements that any alcoholic beverages sold by such establishments must be (1) sold in conjunction with the sale of food prepared for off-site consumption, and (2) "packaged in a container with a secure lid or cap and in a manner designed to prevent consumption without removal of the lid or cap (e.g., no lids with sipping holes or openings for straws).";

WHEREAS, in addition, the ABC requires such establishments to prominently post the following warning in a manner that puts consumers on notice of limitations regarding open container laws: "Alcoholic beverages that are packaged by this establishment are open containers and may not be transported in a motor vehicle except in the vehicle's trunk; or, if there is no trunk, the container may be kept in some other area of the vehicle that is not normally occupied by the driver or passengers (which does not include a utility compartment or glove compartment (Vehicle Code Section 23225)). Further, such beverages may not be consumed in public or in any other area where open containers are prohibited by law.";

WHEREAS, the City has received reports that some restaurants, bars, nightclubs, and similar businesses which serve food and alcohol for off-site consumption are providing alcohol to customers while they are waiting for their meal to be ready, and that customers are – in violation of existing state and local laws prohibiting open containers of alcohol and consuming alcohol in public – opening the alcohol container and consuming the alcohol; and

WHEREAS, in the interest of the public health and safety, as affected by the emergency caused by the spread of COVID-19, it is necessary to exercise my authority pursuant to Chapter 3.08 of the Manhattan Beach Municipal Code, Manhattan Beach City Council Resolution No. 20-0039, and the California Emergency Services Act, Chapter 7 (commencing with Section 8550) of Title 2 of the Government Code, to issue this order.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Order by reference.

<u>Section 2</u>. Pursuant to Manhattan Beach Municipal Section 3.08.060.A.6.a and consistent with City Council direction, the City Manager as the Director of Emergency Services hereby orders the following:

- A. All restaurants, bars, nightclubs, and similar businesses that serve food and alcohol via delivery, pick-up, or drive-thru shall not provide any alcohol to a customer prior to providing the meal prepared for delivery. All alcohol shall be provided to the customer concurrently with the delivery of food.
- B. All such establishments have a duty to monitor customers waiting for food to ensure that no one is consuming alcohol on or adjacent to the premises.

<u>Section 3</u>. Any violation of this Order may be determined to be a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine or imprisonment, or both, pursuant to Government Code Section 8665 and Chapters 1.04 and 1.06 of the Manhattan Beach Municipal Code, and any other state or city law as may be applicable.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Order shall take effect on April 25, 2020, at 12:01 a.m., subject to confirmation as soon as practicable by the City Council.

RECOMMENDATION:

- A. Conduct a public hearing to consider adopting new residential and commercial solid waste collection service rates, effective July 1, 2020;
- B. Consider the Proposition 218 protest ballots submitted to the City Clerk by the close of the public hearing; and
- C. Consider adopting the attached Resolution No. 20-0050 adopting the annual proposed rate increases from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2025.

BACKGROUND:

On May 5, 2020, City Council continued the public hearing to May 12, 2020 to provide additional time for the public to provide input on the proposed rate increases. If approved, the rates will become effective July 1, 2020. The attached staff report and resolution are incorporated by reference into this staff report.

OPEN PUBLIC HEARING AND CONTINUE PUBLIC HEARING TO MAY 12, 2020

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council:

- A) Conduct a public hearing to consider adopting new residential and commercial sold waste collection service rates, effective July 1, 2020;
- B) Consider the Proposition 218 protest ballots submitted to the City Clerk by the close of the public hearing; and
- C) Consider adopting the attached Resolution No. 20-0050 adopting the annual proposed rate increases from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2025.

STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT THE MAYOR OPEN THE PUBLIC HEARING AND THEN, BY ORDER OF THE CHAIR, CONTINUE THE PUBLIC HEARING UNTIL MAY 12, 2020.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

Commercial and residential solid waste hauling fees (rates) are fully paid by the customers receiving refuse service. The City also receives a City Recovery Cost (CRC) for the administration and oversight of the program and solid waste contractor. The current annual waste hauling contract is valued at approximately \$3.8 million. The new annual waste hauling contract rate is expected to be approximately \$5.7 million, representing an increase of \$1.9

million. This increase includes a combination of higher rates for residential and commercial landfill waste, as well as new fees for commercial recycling services.

The City is required to initiate a Proposition 218 majority protest process in order to pass on solid waste collection rate increases to its businesses and residents. Proposition 218 allows municipalities to consider rate adjustments for up to five years. At the end of this five-year term, in order to raise solid waste collection rates, Manhattan Beach will be required to initiate another Proposition 218 process for the remaining two-year term of the contract, as well as consider the rates for the three-one-year optional renewal periods. Notably, if less than 50% of the City's refuse customers protest the solid waste collection rate increases through the Proposition 218 process, then City Council may adopt the attached resolution approving the annual rate increases. The first increase would become effective July 1, 2020. However, if more than 50% of the City's refuse customers protest the proposed rate increases, then the attached resolution could not be adopted. Under this scenario, refuse customers would continue to pay the current waste hauling rates and the City would be obligated to make up the difference between the new and old contracted rates with Waste Management, which is approximately \$1.9 million in year one of the seven-year contract. Over seven years, the total difference between the current fixed rates and the adopted rates with consumer price index (CPI) escalations is estimated to be approximately \$16 million. Note, however, that there are no time restrictions for when the City could initiate a new Proposition 218 process for the same solid waste hauling fees, so re-balloting could occur at any time should this procedure fail.

BACKGROUND:

On March 3, 2020, City Council reviewed and approved the proposed five-year solid waste collection rates increases and adopted Resolution No. 20-0028 setting a public hearing to consider adoption of the new rates for May 5, 2020. City Council also adopted Resolution No. 20-0029 establishing procedures in connection with the rate increases. The new solid waste hauling rate for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-2021 and the rate adjustment calculation method for the subsequent four years are attached. The City mailed the Proposition 218 notice and ballot procedures to each property owner and solid waste rate payer on March 11, 2020. Additionally, staff:

- Prepared and posted on the City's website a PowerPoint presentation with our contact information for questions about the ballot and protest procedures;
- Posted it on the City calendar (from April 1 May 5, 2020).
- Published the availability of the presentation as a news story on the City website, and on Facebook and Twitter:
- Sent e-notifications to multiple subscriber groups; and
- Placed eight 5x7 ads in the Beach Reporter from March 12 April 30, 2020.

DISCUSSION:

In order to implement new customer rates, City Council must conduct a Proposition 218 hearing to approve or reject the new rates at least forty-five days after the notices are mailed. At the public hearing, the City Council must consider all protests or objections to the proposed refuse collection service charge. At the conclusion of the public hearing, the City Council must tabulate the written protests against the proposed refuse collection service charges and determine whether a majority protest exists. Unless protests are received from a majority of rate payers

(50% + 1), the rates may be adopted by a majority vote of City Council at the public hearing.

The City's residential and commercial solid waste customers have been provided the opportunity to protest the proposed rate increases in three ways:

- 1. By submitting a hard copy protest to the City Clerk (via mail or by placing the written protest in the City Hall billing drop-off box located in the City Hall parking lot);
- 2. By emailing the signed protest to cityclerk@citymb.info; and
- 3. By providing it to the City Clerk before the end of the Public Hearing on May 5, 2020.

In order for the rates to be sufficiently protested, and thus *not* passed on to the City's residential and commercial solid waste customers, the City must receive more than 50%, or 6,500, protests ballots. However, if *less than* 50% protest ballots are received, the City Council can adopt Resolution No. 20-0050, setting the rates for residential and commercial solid waste service from Waste Management, which will become effective July 1, 2020.

Waste Management Rates and Annual Increases

The solid waste hauling rates shown in the attachment represent the base rates and CRC for FY 2020-2021, and the rate adjustment calculation method for four additional rate increases to be applied annually on July 1 of each subsequent year (2021-2022, 2022-2023, 2023-2024, and 2024-2025). Waste Management's annual rate increases will be limited to the CPI increase for Trash and Garbage Collection, U.S. City average, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, between the calendar year ended the December prior to the Rate Year anniversary date, and the calendar year ended the prior December.

Lastly, when the new contract takes effect on July 1, 2020, Waste Management will begin billing Manhattan Beach's businesses and residents directly for refuse service. The company will also collect the CRC on the City's behalf and remit it directly to the City on a monthly basis.

Therefore, staff recommends that City Council:

- A) Conduct the public hearing regarding adopting new residential and commercial sold waste collection service rates, effective July 1,2020;
- B) Consider all Proposition 218 protest ballots submitted to the City Clerk by the close of the public hearing; and
- C) If less than 50% protest ballots are received, adopt Resolution No. 20-0050 approving the annual proposed rate increases from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2025.

PUBLIC OUTREACH:

As mentioned above under Background, an extensive amount of public outreach was conducted regarding this scheduled public hearing.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW:

The City has reviewed the proposed activity for compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and has determined that the activity is not a "Project" as defined under Section 15378 of the State CEQA Guidelines; therefore, pursuant to Section 15060(c)(3) of the

State CEQA Guidelines the activity is not subject to CEQA. Thus, no environmental review is necessary.

LEGAL REVIEW:

The City Attorney has reviewed this report and determined that no additional legal analysis is necessary.

RESOLUTION NO. 20-0050

A RESOLUTION OF THE MANHATTAN BEACH CITY COUNCIL ADOPTING RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL REFUSE COLLECTION RATES AND THE CITY COST RECOVERY FEE FOR THE PERIOD OF JULY 1, 2020 – JUNE 30, 2025

WHEREAS, the Manhattan Beach City Council has awarded a contract for hauling and disposal of residential and commercial refuse to Waste Management, USA, Inc.;

WHEREAS, it is now appropriate to set rates for the hauling and disposal of residential and commercial refuse collection, and the City Cost Recovery Fee, for the period beginning July 1, 2020, with adjustments on July 1 in the years 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024;

WHEREAS, the City Council set May 5, 2020 as the date of a public hearing to consider the proposed rate and fees and continued the public hearing to May 12, 2020;

WHEREAS, the City Clerk provided notice of the time and place of the public hearing in accordance with law; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a full and fair duly noticed public hearing on the proposed fee increases where all interested persons were afforded the opportunity to hear and be heard thereon, and the City Council considered all objections and protests thereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MANHATTAN BEACH CITY COUNCIL HEREBY RESOLVES, FINDS AND DETERMINES AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. No Majority Protest. Written protests with respect to the proposed rate and fee increases have not been presented by a majority of owners of the parcels subject to the proposed rate increases or tenants of such parcels directly responsible for the payment of the charges, and therefore no majority protest exists. All protests and objections to the proposed rate and fee increases are hereby overruled.

SECTION 2. Initial Rates. The City Council hereby adopts the City Cost Recovery Fee, and the rates for refuse related services, as set forth in the rate schedule attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference herein.

SECTION 3. Rate Adjustments. The City Council hereby approves the following rate adjustments beginning on July 1, 2021:

- (a) The rates for refuse related services set forth in the attached rate schedule shall be adjusted annually by the percentage change in the average annual Consumer Price Index, for Trash and Garbage Collection (CUUR0000SEHG02), U.S. City average, for the prior calendar year.
- (b) The City Recovery Cost Fee shall be adjusted annually by the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), Los Angeles-Riverside-Orange County, for the prior calendar year.

SECTION 4. If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Resolution. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed and adopted this Resolution and each and all of the provisions thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more of said provisions may be declared invalid.

SECTION 5. The effective date of the new rates and fees is July 1, 2020.

<u>SECTION 6</u>. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution.

For 2021-2022, FY2022-2023, FY2023-2024 and FY2024-2025 solid waste hauling fee increases will be limited to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase for Trash and Carbage Collection (CUUR0000SEHG02), U.S. City average, as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, between the calendar year ended the December prior to the Rate Year anniversary date, and the calendar year ended the prior December. The City's CRC is also adjusted annually and is based on actual cost for administration of the solid waste program but will not exceed 5% annually. The rate adjustment is calculated administratively and is effective on July 1 each year.

Commercial Bin Monthly Rates

Commercial businesses determine rates through a tiered-rate structure for both trash and recycling bins. Commercial customers choose the size and quantity of bins and frequency of collection. Commercial businesses will begin paying for recycling services beginning July 1, 2020. Commercial customers choose the size and quantity of cart and frequency of collection. Public and private schools (pre-school through 12th grade) receive recycling services at no additional charge. Food waste carts and services are provided at no additional charge.

Request by Councilmember Napolitano to Discuss Potential Temporary Use of Public Right-of-Way for Outdoor Dining Purposes During COVID-19 Health Emergency (Community Development Director Tai).

DISCUSS AND PROVIDE DIRECTION

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council discuss the potential temporary use of public right-of-way for outdoor dining purposes during COVID-19 health emergency, and provide direction to staff. The use would rely upon the State and County easing Health Department Orders restricting restaurant dining.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

There are no fiscal implications associated with discussing this topic and providing direction. Depending on Council direction, there may be fiscal implications associated with subsequent analysis of the issue, and implementation of the proposal, or portions thereof.

BACKGROUND:

At the April 29, 2020, City Council meeting, Councilmember Napolitano requested that staff place on a future agenda a discussion item on a request by the Downtown Business and Professional Association to temporarily utilize public right-of-way, such as streets and sidewalks, to provide space for restaurant outdoor dining. This request is based on the expectation that once the Governor lifts restrictions on dining during the COVID-19 recovery transition, health officials will likely require greatly reduced capacity in indoor dining rooms to accommodate social distancing. Councilmember Hadley concurred with Councilmember Napolitano's request to place this item on a future agenda.

DISCUSSION:

Pursuant to Council policy, this item has been placed on the agenda for Council discussion prior to any significant staff time being expended on the concepts. Staff also received communications from two restauranteurs with establishments in Downtown Manhattan Beach with suggestions and concepts (attached) for outdoor dining in on-street parking areas within the public right-of-way. These outdoor dining areas would serve as an extension of the indoor dining area for each restaurant.

The City's Municipal Code currently includes limited allowances for restaurants to have outdoor dining on sidewalks, which are within the public right-of-way. This would be a temporary extension of that allowance to include areas currently used for parking to be used for outdoor dining.

Preliminarily, staff has identified the following issues that may serve as the framework for Council's discussion:

Private Use of Public Space

- The use of public parking spaces for outdoor dining for restaurants impacts public parking supply.
- Removing public parking in the Coastal Zone may affect public access to the beaches.
- The City's Local Coastal Program incorporates parking management plans to balance the needs of businesses and those visiting the beaches. Changes to parking in the coastal zone may require Coastal Commission approval.

Public Safety

- Any approval must ensure public safety access for emergency response
- The proposals must address the ability to protect patrons from motor vehicles if dining is set up in or adjacent to vehicular streets

City Revenue Considerations

- Lost parking meter revenue for the City (\$6,000 to \$7,000 per meter per year)
- Use of public right-of-way for commercial purposes should include the customary charges (Uncle Bill's, Ocean View, Fusion Sushi, etc.)

Additional Considerations

If Council directs staff to explore this concept, there are a number of additional issues that need to be fleshed out, including the following:

- Short term and long term consequences
- If this option is provided to restaurants, how and whether to accommodate other businesses that wish to use public right-of-way for their purposes due to potentially increased social distancing requirements inside their establishments (fitness facilities, retail spaces) or to accommodate curbside transactions?
- Consider how to address similar requests in other areas of the City, such as the North End.
- Consider also how to address requests for properties wishing to use their own private parking lots for outdoor dining.

Permitting / Enforcement Considerations

- Existing Use Permits or City approvals may need to be amended.
- California Department of Alcohol Beverage Control regulations concerning alcohol service and consumption on public right-of-way.

• It is likely that State and County health officials will continue to require social distancing for outdoor dining. If social distancing exemptions pertaining to households still apply, consider how and whether the City should enforce this.

Maintenance and Risk Management Issues

• The City Manager, Public Works Director and the City's Risk Manager would need to explore cost, maintenance responsibilities, insurance, indemnification, etc.

Alternative Suggestions

- For properties with private lots, one option may be to temporarily ease parking ratios to allow outdoor dining.
- For Downtown, in lieu of the curbside plan, could consider the upper Pier parking lots as shared group dining for all restaurants. (Coastal permit may be required.)
- As an alternative to establishing outdoor dining for specific private businesses, encourage continuation of active takeout business by providing public outdoor seating areas in the public-right-of-way (parklet) that can be used by any member of the public, including for restaurant takeout dining.
- To optimize manage restaurant indoor dining room capacity, implement a reservation-only dine-in and/or include limited time at dining tables.
- Create parking spaces for meal service in cars (e.g., old time drive-ins). (Concerns for alcohol consumption).
