- Farmers Market Reopens on May 12 Beginning Tuesday, May 12, the <u>Downtown</u> Manhattan Beach Farmers Market reopens under modified conditions and heightened safety protocols. The safety of the community, shoppers, farmers, and vendors will be held in the utmost regard. The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) published <u>Farmer's Market Events</u> and <u>Guidance for Food Street Vendors</u> references which the Market will be in compliance with. Good practices of current operating Certified Farmers Markets will include a maximum number of shoppers within the market at any one time, controlled entry/exit, heightened food handling, hygiene protocols, and additional safety measures.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- State Extends Deadlines Impacted by COVID-19 Governor Newsom issued an <u>executive</u> order that extends several deadlines impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic that includes:
 - Certification requirements for public school project inspectors who previously passed an initial evaluation:
 - Certified Access Specialists who ensure compliance with disability access in properties and businesses;
 - State Fire Marshal building materials requirements and registration renewals for flame-retardant fabrics and applications;

- o Notaries public whose commissions are set to expire; and
- o Procedural deadlines of the Department of Industrial Relations.

The order also allows retired peace officers to temporarily be re-employed for up to a year if they left the agency in good standing. For more information, visit <u>ca.gov</u>.

- HHS Awards Half Billion to Expand COVID-19 Testing The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), <u>awarded nearly \$583 million to 1,385 HRSA-funded health centers</u> throughout the nation to expand COVID-19 testing. Health centers are currently providing more than 100,000 weekly COVID-19 tests in local communities.
- CARES Act to Benefit Fisherman The <u>U.S. Secretary of Commerce Allocated \$300 Million</u> to aid U.S. fishermen and seafood industries impacted by COVID-19. The funds were allocated as part of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). The fisherman and seafood industries eligible to apply for the funds include commercial fishing, charter/for-hire businesses, qualified aquaculture operations, processors, and parts of the seafood sector in coastal states and territories. - LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 Public Health has confirmed 44 new deaths and 1,011 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,512 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 227,000 individuals and 12% of people testing positive. As of today, 5,363 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (17% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness.
