COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT MAY 10, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Stage Two Progress Public Health issued a five-stage <u>roadmap to recovery</u> that describes a phased approach to slowly relaxing select directives of the Safer at Home Order and a reopening process for certain business sectors. Currently, the County is in phase two, which allows bookstores, florists, clothing and shoe stores, sporting goods stores, toy stores, and music stores to reopen with appropriate adaptations and curbside pickup only. Until final stage five is reached, Health Officer Orders and directives will continue. People who have underlying health conditions are at much greater risk for serious illness from COVID-19 and should call health care providers immediately even if for mild symptoms. It continues to be very important for residents to <u>stay at home as much as possible and to leave home only for essential needs</u>.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- HHS Coordinates COVID-19 Treatments Using Remdesivir The <u>U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced</u> that shipments of donated Remdesivir for hospitalized patients with COVID-19 have been allocated to state health departments. Preliminary results suggest that Remdesivir is associated with faster recovery. The federal government is supplying approximately 607,000 vials of the experimental drug to treat an estimated 78,000 hospitalized COVID-19 patients under the Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) granted by the FDA.
- Processing Plants Operate Compliant with Guidance The President signed an <u>executive</u> order under the Defense Production Act to ensure meat and poultry processors continue operations consistent with the guidance jointly issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) regarding worker health and safety during the Coronavirus Pandemic.
- COVID-19 Home Test The <u>U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) authorized</u> the first diagnostic test with the option of using home-collected saliva samples for COVID-19 testing. Specifically, the FDA issued an EUA to permit testing of samples self-collected by patients at home. The FDA has authorized more than 80 COVID-19 tests and adding more options for at-home sample collection is an important advancement in diagnostic testing. See <u>fda.gov</u> for more information.

- COVID-19 Statewide As of May 9, 955,664 tests have been conducted in California and reported to the California Department of Public Health. These numbers include data from all sources and the <u>state and county health labs</u> currently testing. The state's <u>portal</u> tracks COVID-19 cases statewide and by county, gender, age and ethnicity. <u>Tables in the portal</u> depict race and ethnicity data. - Latest COVIDView Surveillance Report The Center for Disease Control and Prevention
 (CDC) launched <u>COVIDView</u> a weekly surveillance summary of United States COVID-19

- LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 Public Health has confirmed 18 new deaths and 484 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,530 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 245,000 individuals and 11% of people testing positive. As of today, 5,410 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (17% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness.
