COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT MAY 11, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- LA County Beaches Reopen for Limited Activities May 13 Los Angeles County will reopen the beaches, including Manhattan Beach beginning Wednesday, May 13, with restrictions. The restrictions include limited active recreation with physical distancing and face coverings as a requirement. Active recreation includes walking, running, surfing, and swimming. Not permitted are chairs, canopies, coolers, grills, sunbathing, gatherings of any size, or organized recreational programming such as beach volleyball. Violators may be subject to fines and criminal prosecution. The Strand, Pier, bike path, and parking lots remain closed.
- Farmers Market Reopens Tomorrow The City of Manhattan Beach City Council approved the reopening of the Manhattan Beach Farmers Market, beginning May 12 under modified conditions and heightened safety protocols. The safety of the community, shoppers, farmers, and vendors will be held in the utmost regard and good practices of current operating Certified Farmers Markets will include: a maximum number of shoppers within the market at any one time, controlled entry/exit, heightened food handling & hygiene protocols, and additional safety measures. Please note that the Farmers Market will be operating with modified market hours from 11–3pm. The Market entrance will be at the corner of 13th and Morningside with cloth face coverings required for entry.

- Western States Pact Urge for Federal Support Governor Newsom with the legislative leaders from the western states in a letter to Congressional leadership, requested \$1 trillion in direct and flexible relief to states (California, Colorado, Oregon, Nevada, and Washington) and local governments in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. The request is to preserve core government services such as public health, public safety, public education, and help people get back to work. See <u>ca.gov</u> for more information.
- Access the Digital Library Safely from Home While all LA County library locations are closed, including Manhattan Beach, you can visit the library without leaving home. With your LA County Library card, access FREE library resources on your computer or mobile device. Download or stream eBooks, audiobooks, magazines, and movies all without overdue fines. Find help with homework, learn a language, or take an online class. Other resources include Activity Ideas (from mazes to scavenger hunts), DIY Library Programs, and Books & Learning lists (which pair digital reads with other online resources). - Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Respond to COVID-19 The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) continues to release waivers and requirements for the healthcare community that provide flexibilities needed to take care of patients during the COVID-19 public health emergency. - LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 Public Health has confirmed 39 new deaths and 591 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,569 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 240,000 individuals and 12% of people testing positive. This is a correction to yesterday's count of over 245,000 individuals tested and is due to the inclusion of serology test results. As of today, 5,437 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (17% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness.
