# COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT MAY 13, 2020

#### CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Additional Security Measures In light of all the activity surrounding the bioluminescence ocean phenomenon and in advance of the weekend, the City has adopted additional security measures to reduce the impact to our residents and business. Beginning the evening hours this Friday, Saturday and Sunday, additional security personnel will be deployed by the Police Department in the areas of Downtown Manhattan Beach, El Porto, and the walk streets along the Strand. The additional personnel will be responsible for restricting visitor access to the Strand and beach and also help re-direct vehicular traffic in problem areas such as Ocean Drive. Staffing levels will be evaluated throughout the weekend to determine overall effectiveness. We thank our community for your patience, support and understanding during this most challenging time.
- All City Parks Partially Re-Opened Following last week's announcement of a gradual, phased-in, limited reopening of specific parks and amenities, the City has re-opened the open/green space at all parks in the City. These additional park re-openings include: Bruce's Beach, Manhattan Heights Park, Manhattan Village Park, Marine Avenue Park, Eighth Street Parquette, and Larsson Street Parquette. While the open and green/space are accessible, the park restrooms, playgrounds, community centers, picnic areas, basketball courts, dog runs, skate spot, fitness equipment, gazebos, and benches remain closed until further notice. Social distancing will be required and the policy of no contact surfaces will remain in effect. The City continues to strongly encourage residents to wear face coverings while in public, including in parks. - Older Adults and Vulnerable Populations Hotline Assists Residents As of May 11, the City's Hotline has received over 322 calls for services related to Dial-A-Ride and older adult assistance. Our local community groups have stepped up and continue to work with older adults in need. We thank the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), Rotary Club, Beach Cities Health District, Neighborhood Watch, and Leadership Manhattan Beach for stepping up when our community needs you most! - Strand Reopening Consideration At tomorrow's City Council meeting taking place at 8:00AM, the City Council will consider additional measures to address COVID-19. One of the measures that may be considered, is the reopening of the Strand. ### FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Newest LA County Public Health Order Today, LA County Department of Public Health (Public Health) announced a revised health order advising that all retailers -- except for indoor malls and shopping centers -- can re-open for curbside, pickup or delivery. The manufacturers and logistics businesses that supply those retailers will also be allowed to reopen. The Order does not allow customers to enter stores, and requires businesses to take several steps to ensure they are following public health protocols designed to limit the spread of COVID-19. The Order also allows recreation opportunities at beaches, shooting and archery ranges, community gardens, bike parks, and equestrian centers to re-open. Additionally, the Order states the it will remain in effect until it is extended, rescinded, superseded or amended in writing by the Health Officer. Visit lacounty.gov to read the Health Order. The City is still analyzing the Health Officer Order and will provide additional information in the future.
- Class Instructions of California Colleges during COVID-19 Colleges and universities have created instructional requirements for students and faculty to safely abide by social distancing mandates. - Disbursement of CARES Act Aid to El Camino College Students The CARES Act, included funding of almost \$14 billion for colleges and universities. Of El Camino College's \$11.7 million allocation, \$5.8 million was designated as direct aid to students for their education-related costs such as textbooks, technology, and other similar expenses. Funds are being disbursed beginning today. See elcamino.edu for more information.
- LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 Public Health has confirmed 47 new deaths and 1,264 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,659 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 264,000 individuals and 11% of people testing positive. As of today, 5,596 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (16% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness.
