COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT MAY 15, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- City Hall and City Facilities Closed Until Further Notice City Hall and City Facilities remain
 closed to the public until further notice, but preparations for the re-opening transition are
 underway. The public is encouraged to utilize available online and remote services. These
 services can be found on the City's website. The City of Manhattan Beach thanks you for your
 patience and cooperation with the "Safer at Home" orders. We know the pandemic has resulted
 in enormous difficulties and challenges for everyone.
- City to Re-Open Tennis, Paddleball and Pickleball Courts Beginning Friday, May 22 at 7:00 AM, the City tennis courts, paddleball courts and pickleball courts will re-open with modified hours and restrictions for public access, singles play only, in compliance with LA County Department of Public Health (DPH) tennis protocols. To reduce crowding at the courts and provide a streamlined process for players to secure a court, online reservations will begin Tuesday May 19. Phone-in reservations and walk-on play will not be accepted. Individuals may reserve a court at Live Oak Park or Manhattan Heights for 50 minutes per day to allow players to vacate before the next reservation arrives. Players must label their balls or use different colored balls to avoid sharing equipment when serving or clearing the court. Visit citymb.info/tennis for more detailed information.
- Additional Security Measures in Manhattan Beach Beginning today, additional security personnel have been deployed by the Police Department in the areas of Downtown Manhattan Beach, El Porto, and the walk streets along the Strand. The City increased security measures to proactively address outdoor activity, foot traffic, and any impact to residents and businesses. The additional personnel will also help re-direct vehicular traffic in problem areas such as Ocean Drive and monitor neighborhood parking. The parking lots at El Porto, Bruce's Beach and the Pier are closed to beachgoers. Only those with parking permits are allowed to park at El Porto. Security staffing levels will be evaluated throughout the weekend to determine overall effectiveness.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Projections in Healthcare / Predictive Modeling DPH released an updated <u>COVID-19</u>
 <u>Projections of Hospital-based Health Care Demand</u>. The key findings state:
 - "The overall volume of hospital-based care for patients with COVID-19 appears generally stable, within the model uncertainty, consistent with prior predictions;
 - Prior to the relaxation of physical distancing requirements, it appears the effective transmission number, commonly called "R," was likely less than one. This value would be associated with a decrease in cases over time;
 - It is not yet known what effect the relaxation of physical distancing requirements will have on transmission of COVID-19. If transmission increases, modeling predicts that an increase in patient volume at healthcare facilities would occur after delay of approximately 2-4 weeks; and
 - The number of hospital beds, ICU beds, and ventilators in Los Angeles County
 appears adequate to meet the projected need for the care of additional COVID-19
 patients over the next 4 weeks, unless there is a marked increase in transmission."
- LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 DPH has confirmed 47 new deaths and 962 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,755 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 282,000 individuals and 11% of people testing positive. As of today, 5,727 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (16% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness.
