FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Assistance for Business Owners and Self-Employed The State of California Employment Development Department (EDD) is offering Pandemic Unemployment Assistance. As part of the federal CARES Act, the new Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) program helps unemployed Californians. This program serves business owners, self-employed, independent contractors, persons with limited work history, and others not usually eligible for regular state unemployment insurance benefits who are out of business or services are reduced due to the pandemic. - Latest COVIDView Surveillance Report The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) launched <u>COVIDView</u> a weekly surveillance summary of United States COVID-19 activity. - LA County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 LA County Department of Public Health (DPH) has confirmed 29 new deaths and 694 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 1,821 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in LA County, with testing results available for over 309,000 individuals and 11% of people testing positive. As of today, 5,816 people who tested positive for COVID-19 (16% of positive cases) have been hospitalized at some point during their illness.
