CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

 Memorial Weekend Plans - The City of Manhattan Beach reminds anyone heading to the beach to celebrate the Memorial Day holiday to practice personal responsibility by complying with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health orders and social distancing requirements.

Visitors to the beach are reminded to "beach responsibly" by following the County guidelines below:

- Bring a face covering to be worn while out of the water and around others. Infants and children under the age of two should not wear cloth face coverings.
- Practice social distancing. Stay at least six feet away from other people who are not in your household. Avoid crowded areas or crowding around others at the beach.
- Gatherings of any size or other events are not allowed on the beaches including athletic competitions, youth camps, or recreational programming.
- Chairs, umbrellas, canopies, coolers, and grills are not allowed.
- The Pier and volleyball courts remain closed.
- Concessions and food vending are not allowed.
- Additional Manhattan Beach Security Measures The City increased weekend security
 measures to address outdoor activity, foot traffic, and any impact on residents and businesses.
 During the holiday weekend, the additional personnel will monitor beach access, re-direct
 vehicular traffic in any problem areas, and monitor neighborhood parking. As a reminder,
 beach parking lots are closed (except for permit holders).

- Additional Openings With Restrictions Los Angeles County has announced additional openings in time for the holiday weekend. The <u>beach bike paths</u> are open, indoor malls can open for <u>curbside service</u>, and car parades are allowed. Safety protocols and restrictions apply. Read the <u>L.A. - L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 DPH has confirmed 35 new deaths and 1,072 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 2,049 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in L.A. County, with testing results available for over 412,000 individuals and 9% of people testing positive. 6,093 people who tested positive for COVID-19 have been hospitalized (14% of positive cases) at some point during their illness.
