CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- City Council to Consider Presentation of the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Proposed Operating
 Budget At Tuesday's City Council meeting at 6:00 PM, Council will discuss next year's
 operating budget that takes into account impacts from COVID-19. View the <u>agenda and</u>

 the City Council encourages the public to participate by using one of the options to submit public
 comments found on the City's <u>website</u>.
- Celebrate Memorial Weekend at a Distance As more people move around the community, so does the virus. You may be tempted to get together with family members, friends, and neighbors; however, the L.A. County Department of Public Health (PDH) <u>Safer at Home Order</u> is still in place. There is greater urgency to use the new habits we have developed. Keep <u>socially distant</u> from others at all times (except between members of the same household). Keep <u>faces covered</u> when around others, not from the same household (except infants and children under the age of two). Wash hands frequently and stay home except for essential activities. Please avoid all gatherings, and plan ahead so you can follow the safer at home mandates during Memorial Weekend. See the <u>Memorial Day Holiday Reminders Press Release</u>.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Updated Airport Security Procedures The <u>Transportation Security Administration (TSA)</u> released updated security procedures in response to COVID-19. In addition to face coverings and social distancing, changes include travelers scanning their own boarding pass in the presence of the TSA officer, and packaging carry-on food items into clear plastic bags and placing them into a bin during the screening process. - Share Your Story As we continue to live through these unprecedented times, L.A. County Library wants to help you connect socially while still staying physically apart. L.A. County Library invites you to share your story of what living through this time has been like including the emotional, funny, and somewhere in between whether it means staying at home, serving as an essential worker, teaching your children, rediscovering yourself, or living in sweatpants. - Skilled Nursing Facilities to Benefit from the CARES Act The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is distributing billions in relief funds to skilled nursing facilities (SNFs) to combat the devastating effects of COVID-19. Since 2020 began, SNFs have experienced a 6 percent decline in patient population as current residents choose other care settings, or passed

- away. Many SNF employees have also been diagnosed with COVID-19. The relief funds may help nursing homes address critical needs directly linked to the pandemic. See hhs.gov for more information.
- Scams Related to Coronavirus Economic Impact Payments The Cybersecurity and
 Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), U.S. Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service
 (IRS), and United States Secret Service (USSS) released a Joint Alert. The purpose of the alert is
 to warn the public of economic impact payment scams, particularly attempts to steal payments,
 personal and financial information, and disrupt payment efforts. CISA encourages consumers to

- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 DPH has confirmed 41 new deaths and 1,032 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 2,090 deaths; ninety-three percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in L.A. County, with testing results available for over 436,000 individuals and 9% of people testing positive. 6,159 people who tested positive for COVID-19 have been hospitalized (14% of positive cases) at some point during their illness.
