CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Special City Council Meeting Called Tomorrow to Consider Additional Requests to County Tomorrow, the City Council will hold a Special Meeting at 1:30 PM to consider two letters to send to the County. The first letter is to L.A. County Supervisor Hahn to support the granting of variances to the County's Health Officer Orders for individual cities. The second letter is to the entire Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors advocating for south bay businesses and restaurants to re-open under State and County phase 3 guidelines. - Celebrate Memorial Day at a Distance As more people move around the community, so does the virus. You may be tempted to get together with family members, friends, and neighbors; however, the L.A. County Department of Public Health (PDH) <u>Safer at Home Order</u> is still in place. There is greater urgency to use the new habits we have developed. Keep <u>socially distant</u> from others at all times (except between members of the same household). Keep <u>faces covered</u> when around others, not from the same household (except infants and children under the age of two). Wash hands frequently and stay home except for essential activities. FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Cargo on Airplane Seats The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) issued an exemption that allows <u>U.S. airlines to carry cargo</u> on seats in airplane cabins when no passengers are traveling. The FAA determined the exemption would reduce the chance that the movement of critical cargo would be interrupted as a result of the COVID-19 public health emergency. To exercise the exemption, airlines must submit a letter of intent and receive specific authorization from the FAA, and observe several conditions and limitations. - Safer Outdoors During COVID-19 With residents being safer at home, the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) issued several <u>safety checklists</u> to help consumers avoid injuries

- during the pandemic while tending to outdoor <u>yard work</u>, <u>home repairs</u>, <u>play and exercise</u>. CPSC urges consumers to safeguard your family from outdoor product-related hazards. Visit <u>cpsc.gov</u> for more information.
- V.A. Services Begin to Re-Open The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (V.A.) <u>announced the re-opening of its V.A. facilities</u>. The department has begun to reintroduce health care services in select V.A. facilities as states re-open from COVID-19 shutdowns. Each Veterans Integrated Service Network (VISN) has selected lead sites to be the first to implement a phased approach to reintroducing select health care services while ensuring a safe environment. - L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 DPH has confirmed 14 new deaths and 940 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 2,104 deaths; ninety-three percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in L.A. County, with testing results available for over 465,000 individuals and 8% of people testing positive. 6,177 people who tested positive for COVID-19 have been hospitalized (14% of positive cases) at some point during their illness.
