CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Revised Public Health Order Issued by County of Los Angeles Today, the County of Los
 Angeles Public Health permitted additional activities with safety protocols. The modified <u>Public Health Order</u> allows activities such as: faith-based services, retail in, flea markets and other
 activities. The City will distribute a press release tomorrow detailing the Public Health Order.
- County of LA to Requests Variance from State In the County of Los Angeles's announcement
 of the revised Public Health Order, the press release stated, "The change also sets the stage for
 the County to request a variance from the state to permit swifter reopening of some sectors."
 Given this, the City expects the County to submit a variance request to align with the State's
 recovery phases.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- What's Open in L.A. County Given the confusion DPH has published a <u>Safer at Home Order</u>: <u>Examples of What's Open in Los Angeles County</u> document that lists what is open and closed for now during the <u>Safer at Home Order</u> (revised 5/22/2020). The list covers: 1) Recreation, Entertainment, and Learning 2) Shopping, Restaurants, and Personal Care, and 3) Healthcare Services.
- COVID-19 Updated Master Question List The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) published an Updated COVID-19 Master Question List (MQL). The MLQ is intended to quickly present available information for decision-makers in the operational response to COVID-19 and allow structured and scientifically guided discussions across the federal government, prevent duplication of efforts, and highlight and coordinate research. - Simulated Sunlight Inactivates SARS-CoV-2 on Surfaces S&T's National Biodefense Analysis and Countermeasures Center published a study titled <u>Simulated Sunlight Rapidly Inactivates</u> <u>SARS-CoV-2 on Surfaces</u> in the Journal of Infectious Diseases. SARS-CoV-2 is the coronavirus that causes COVID-19. This research provides the first evidence that sunlight may rapidly inactivate SARS-CoV-2 on surfaces. Findings in this research will shape the operational response to COVID-19. Visit the <u>Journal of Infectious Diseases</u> for more information.
- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 DPH has confirmed 27 new deaths and 1,843 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 2,143 deaths; ninety-three percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in L.A. County, with testing results available for over 514,000 individuals and 8% of people testing positive. 6,195 people who tested positive for COVID-19 have been hospitalized (13% of positive cases) at some point during their illness.
