- City Council to Discuss the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Budget and Additional COVID-19 Measures Tuesday, June 2, 6:00 PM At Tuesday's City Council meeting, Council will continue to discuss the City's proposed Fiscal Year 2020-2021 budget and additional measures to address COVID-19 which includes parks re-opening. ## FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Update on County-Run COVID-19 Testing Sites Due to the current State of Emergency in Los Angeles County, the operations of some county testing sites were closed today. All patients who have registered for appointments were notified by email or phone to reschedule. Visit lacounty.gov/testing for the most updated list of testing sites any and changes to operational hours impacted by local curfews.
- Actions in Response to COVID-19 <u>Governor Newsom issued an Executive Order</u> that addresses a variety of issues in response to the pandemic, which includes:
  - o An extension for local governments to halt evictions for renters through July 28;
  - An extension to the Department of Motor Vehicles drivers' licenses and identification cards mail-in renewals;
  - o Waiving administrative requirements that restrict child care of essential workers; and
  - o Individuals enrolled in the 2019-20 school year scheduled to obtain their preliminary credential, waiving the teacher performance assessment requirement for the education specialist credential due to the statewide stay-at-home Order. Visit gov.ca for more information.
- Protect Yourself from COVID-19 When Using Transportation As businesses and community organizations begin providing services, be sure to protect yourself and slow the spread of COVID-19 when using transportation. Considerations include, what is feasible, practical, and acceptable to meets your needs. To assist public's health and safety, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) provided transportation tips for people for rideshare, taxi, limo for-hire vehicles, as well as shared bikes, scooters, skateboards, and other micro-mobility devices. - CDC Search Database of COVID-19 Resources The CDC has created a State, Territorial, Local, and Tribal Health Department <u>Search Database of COVID-19 Resources</u>. Viewers can search for thousands of COVID-19 terms and resources across various languages and file types. - Projections in Healthcare / Predictive Modeling The Los Angeles County <u>Department of Health Services</u> (DHS) released an updated <u>COVID-19 Projections of Hospital-based Health Care Demand</u>. This update includes data on hospital visits and volume through May 26. One of the key findings state, "The overall volume of hospital-based care for patients with COVID-19 appears generally stable or slightly down trending, within the model uncertainty, consistent with prior predictions." - Latest COVIDView Surveillance Report The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) launched COVIDView, a weekly surveillance summary of United States COVID-19 activity. - L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 DPH has confirmed 22 new deaths and 978 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 2,384 deaths; ninety-three percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in L.A. County, with testing results available for over 612,000 individuals and 8% of people testing positive. 6,528 people who tested positive for COVID-19 have been hospitalized (12% of positive cases) at some point during their illness.
