CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- City Solicits Input on Outdoor Dining The Manhattan Beach City Council has been discussing a plan to allow temporary outdoor dining and business uses within public parking spaces for restaurants and businesses to accommodate social distancing measures required by State and County protocols to limit the spread of COVID-19. The City Council will discuss this matter on Tuesday, June 9, at 6:00 PM to make a determination on whether to allow this temporary use through the City's existing encroachment permit process. To gauge community feedback, the City has launched a brief survey. Your input is valued and appreciated!
- Summer Camp Registration On Hold The health and safety of our campers is our priority. Therefore, Manhattan Beach onsite summer camp registration is currently on hold until updated guidelines from the State and L.A. County Department of Public Health are received. Campers are welcome to register for the waitlist and will be contacted once programming resumes. Manhattan Beach Parks & Recreation Staff are working closely with cities within the County as well as L.A. County Parks & Recreation to develop protocols and safeguards to protect the health of participants in preparation for the lifting of the Public Health Order restrictions.
- COVID-19 Updates on Weekly Basis The City of Manhattan Beach remains committed to
 providing the community with critical information and updates on the COVID-19 pandemic,
 despite a second countywide emergency order related to civil unrest. Starting this week, the
 daily COVID-19 Situation Report will be weekdays only, Monday through Friday. Therefore no
 updates will be received this weekend. Should any COVID-19 or civil unrest developments
 happen over the weekend, the City will release timely information using platforms that
 include: Nixle Public Safety Alerts, Facebook, Twitter, Nextdoor, Instagram, and post content on
 the City's website.

- COVID-19 Testing Given that people without symptoms can transmit the novel coronavirus, people potentially exposed in a crowd are strongly encouraged to test for COVID-19. Most County and State-run testing sites are open. Same day appointments are available at State operated OptumServe sites. - Remote County Court Appearance Amidst COVID-19 The Superior Court of California, <u>County of Los Angeles, launched remote courtroom appearance technology</u> capabilities, a convenient and safe option to access justice in the trial court. LACourtConnect allows attorneys and self-represented litigants the opportunity to make audio or video appearances for probate, civil, family law, and traffic cases. - COVID-19 Nursing Home Data Now Available The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
 Services (CMS) has released its first public COVID-19 nursing home report. CMS required nursing
 homes to inform residents, their families, and their representatives of COVID-19 cases in their
 facilities. In addition, nursing homes were required to report COVID-19 cases and deaths directly
 to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). View a summary of the Long Term

- Update on Economic Impact Payments The <u>U.S. Department of the Treasury and IRS</u> announced \$159 million Economic Impact Payments, worth more than \$267 billion, have been distributed in two months. Payments have been sent to all eligible for whom the IRS has the information to make a payment. Individuals who do not normally file taxes and have not yet received an Economic Impact Payment (EIP) should use the <u>Non-Filers Tool</u>. The tool will be available until October 15; registrations by October 15 will receive payment by the end of the year. - EDD Introduced New Help Tools to Assist Workers The Employment Development
 Department (EDD) recently announced a chat bot on Facebook (Send Message) as well as on
 the website titled "EDD Help" to answer claimant questions. EDD also launched a new text
 message service and updated the Frequently Asked Questions page featuring the most common

- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 L.A. County Department of Public Health has confirmed 36 new deaths and 1,446 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 2,565 deaths; ninety-four percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in L.A. County, with testing results available for over 672,000 individuals and 8% of people testing positive. 6,833 people who tested positive for COVID-19 have been hospitalized (11% of positive cases) at some point during their illness.
