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# COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT June 8, 2020

#### CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Anti-Eviction Ordinance Update City Council adopted an urgency ordinance that provides temporary protection for commercial and residential tenants during the COVID-19 local emergency. Highlights include a reduction in the notification period from 30 days to 7 days for tenants to notify landlords starting July 1. Landlords cannot evict tenants for failure to pay rent if that failure is COVID-19 related. The Anti-Eviction Ordinance does not relieve the tenant of liability for the unpaid rent; the tenant must pay the rent within six months of the expiration of the COVID-19 local emergency. If you have not yet completed the brief survey on outdoor dining, take a few minutes, and complete the survey before the survey input period ends tomorrow at 3 PM! The Manhattan Beach City Council has been discussing a plan to allow temporary outdoor dining and business use within public parking spaces for restaurants and businesses. Outdoor dining will accommodate social distancing measures required by State and County protocols to limit the spread of COVID-19. The City Council will discuss this matter tomorrow night. Your input is valued and appreciated!
- City Council to Discuss Budget, Outdoor Dining, Retail, Public Parking and Additional COVID-19 Measures Tuesday, June 9, 6:00 PM At Tuesday's City Council meeting, Council will discuss the Fiscal Year 2020-2021 budget, outdoor dining, retail options on the public right-of-way (sidewalks or parking spaces), and private property for restaurants and businesses to accommodate social distancing measures required by state and county protocols to limit the spread of COVID-19. - Comprehensive Data Reports Improves Response to COVID-19 The U.S. Department of
  Health and Human Services (HHS) announced new guidance that specifies what additional data
  laboratories must report to HHS along with COVID-19 test results. The Guidance standardizes
  reporting to ensure that public health officials have access to comprehensive and nearly realtime data to inform decision making in response to COVID-19. Visit <a href="hhs.gov">hhs.gov</a> for more information.
- PPE for Front-Line Workers to Re-Open Safely Governor Newsom announced that a stable, reliable, and local supply of personal protective equipment (PPE) from California-based BYD North America received its certification from the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH). BYD produces N95 respirators for the State. Cal OES explicitly required NIOSH certification of N95 in the BYD contract so that California's doctors, nurses, and front-line workers can be confident that the N95 masks they receive from the State are of the highest quality and meet federal health and safety standards. BYD North America will begin shipping the PPE to front-line workers to help sectors re-open safely. Visit ca.gov for more information.

- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 L.A. County Department of Public Health has confirmed ten new deaths and 823 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 2,655 deaths; ninety-three percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in L.A. County, with testing results available for over 708,000 individuals and 8% of people testing positive. 6,923 people who tested positive for COVID-19 have been hospitalized (11% of positive cases) at some point during their illness.
