- Citywide Street Sweeping Resumes Beginning on Monday, June 15, the City will resume
  citywide street sweeping of public streets and will allow a grace period for residents to comply
  with street sweeping parking regulations. Stay tuned for more details in a future announcement.
- County Releases Re-Opening Protocols for Public Beach Use This evening, the County
  published a re-opening protocol on public beach use that allows chairs, canopies and coolers on the
  beach. In addition, one public health requirement states, "Gatherings of any size or other events
  such as athletic competitions are not allowed on the beaches. Summer beach and surf camps
  are permitted and must follow the public health day camp protocol. Other athletic beach camps

- EDD Expands Its Mass Hiring Effort With increased federal funding due to increased claim activity, the Employment Development Department (EDD) continues to expedite a mass hiring effort to fill more than 4,800 positions over the next several weeks. So far, several hundred are already on board and in training, while more than 1,700 have received conditional job offers. Visit edd.ca.gov for more information.
- California State Parks COVID-19 Resource Center California State Parks created an <u>online</u> <u>portal</u> to serve as a one-stop center to find information on State Park closures, modifications, and resources available. Park operations are modified to provide an outdoor experience that reduces the risk and exposure to COVID-19. Modifications at each park vary. Visitors should prepare and check the <u>webpage of the park unit</u> you plan to visit before leaving home to find out what new guidelines are in effect. - COVID-19 Training for Health Centers This U.S. Department of Health and Human Services
  (HHS), through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), awarded \$8 million to
  organizations that provide training and technical assistance to HRSA-funded health centers
  nationwide. These organizations provide critical COVID-19 resources to health centers, including
  support and expertise to advance health centers' ability to prevent, prepare, and respond to the

- CURE ID App to Assist in Treatment of COVID-19 The Food and Drug Administration and the National Institute of Health updated the CURE ID crowd-sourcing app. The public-private partnership has made it easier for healthcare providers to document their experience treating COVID-19 patients using a mobile device or the website. Healthcare providers worldwide are encouraged to use CURE ID's web-based repository to share their experience and use of drugs in the treatment of COVID-19. Visit fda.gov for more information.
- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 L.A. County Department of Public Health has confirmed 46 new deaths and 1,857 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily briefing. There are a total of 2,813 deaths; ninety-three percent of people who died had underlying health conditions. Testing capacity continues to increase in L.A. County, with testing results available for over 746,000 individuals and 8% of people testing positive. 7,190 people who tested positive for COVID-19 have been hospitalized (11% of positive cases) at some point during their illness.
