COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT JULY 21, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Weekend Activity in the City Over the weekend, the City saw increased activity around the beaches and downtown areas in the City and supplemented these areas with additional security and code enforcement staff to ensure COVID-19 resitrictions compliance. Additionally, city staff placed a variety of physical and digital signage to inform vistors of resitrctions. It is estimated that approximately 25,000 people visited the beach and 20,000 people visited the downtown area. While the City generally saw a large degree of compliance with face coverings, code enforcement staff cited individuals who violated the City's Emergency Order on face coverings and advised those individuals who wore them incorrectly to wear it properly where needed. The City thanks the community for their understanding during this time and appreciates the high compliance levels that were achieved.
- Pandemic Plan for Learning and Safe Schools The Manhattan Beach Unified School District Board of Trustees will meet via teleconference on Wednesday, July 22, at 5:00 PM to discuss reopening of MBUSD schools and examining re-opening options for Preschool, Extended Day Program (EDP), and Supervised Child Care Options. Residents may view the meeting on the District's Youtube channel. Visit mbusd.org for more information. Governor Newson's pandemic plan for returning safely to schools was published Friday. Highlights include:
 - Safe in-person school based on local health data (schools located in counties that are on the <u>Monitoring List</u> must NOT physically open for in-person instruction until off the list for 14 consecutive days);
 - 2. All staff and students in the third grade and above will be required to wear a face covering;
 - 3. Physical distancing requirements and other adaptations;
 - 4. Regular testing and dedicated contact tracing for outbreaks at schools; and
 - 5. Rigorous distance learning that includes daily live interactions for every child, assignments that are equivalent to in-person instruction, and targeted supports and interventions for special education students.

Wear a Face Covering in Public – As of July 15, the City of Manhattan Beach has an Emergency
 Order in place, strengthening the requirement for face coverings. All persons shall wear a face
 covering over both the nose and mouth whenever leaving their residence. Citations have been
 issued for failing to wear a face covering with fines starting at \$100 for the first violation, \$200

- for the second, and \$350 for each subsequent offense after that. The Order has limited exceptions, view the <u>press release</u> for more details.
- City Visits Approximately 200 Businesses in Education Campaign -The City's partnership with the Chamber of Commerce in the Safe in the South Bay campaign is off to an excellent start! Fifty (50) businesses in Manhattan Beach out of the 86 in the South Bay have taken the Safe in the South Bay pledge. Taking the pledge commits to following the proper protocols to safely reopen and slow the spread of COVID-19 for their employees and customers. Later this week, the Safe in the South Bay campaign signs will be posted in these fifty businesses! Make sure your business is one of them and take the pledge. - Businesses Expand Dining and Retail Outdoors Several businesses successfully expanded
 their dining and retail operations outdoors following the <u>DPH Revised Order</u> for the closure of
 indoor, in-person dining, whereby Council took immediate action (see <u>press release</u>). Businesses
 interested in expanding dining or retail use outdoors, should <u>email</u> the Community Development
 Department or call (310) 802-5520 to apply for an Outdoor Facilities Permit.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

Update on COVID-19 Testing – The <u>California Department of Public Health recently updated its Testing Guidance</u>. There are four tiers in test priorities. Tier One Priority testing is for hospitalized individuals with COVID-19 symptoms, investigation, and management of outbreaks (includes contact tracing) and close contacts of confirmed cases. Visit <u>cdph.ca.gov</u> for more details on Testing Guidance. County residents needing a COVID-19 test are strongly encouraged first to contact their Primary Care Provider or Healthcare Center about receiving a test at their facility. If

- you do not have access to this care or are unable to contact them, free testing is available. The local County test site is at the <u>Beach Cities Health District</u> campus in Redondo Beach. To schedule a test, visit <u>lacounty.gov/testing</u> or call 2-1-1.
- COVID-19 Results in a Two-Season High School Sports Calendar <u>The California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) released its 2020-21 Sports Calendars</u>. Highlights include two seasons of sports instead of three, an extension of summertime rules, and due to the emergency situation (COVID-19), athletes will be able to compete simultaneously with club teams during the high school season of their sport. - Update on Isolation and Quarantine In coordination with the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), CDPH published an updated <u>Guidance on Isolation and Quarantine for</u> <u>COVID-19 Contact Tracing</u>. The majority of people with COVID-19 do not require hospitalization and isolation takes place at home. The update provides <u>guidance</u> for the patient, caregivers, and household. - Drivers Licenses for 70+ Now Valid until 2021 The <u>California Department of Motor Vehicles</u> (<u>DMV</u>) provided an automatic one-year extension to <u>Californians age 70 and older</u> with a noncommercial driver license with an expiration date between March 1 and December 31, 2020. This action delays the requirement for a visit to the DMV. <u>The DMV previously provided</u> extensions to <u>commercial drivers to September 30</u>. - California Grants Portal- Grants and loans are available on the all-new <u>California Grants</u>
 Portal created by the California State Library. Billions of dollars in state grant opportunities from dozens of state departments and agencies are easily accessible from a single and unique destination. All grants and funding opportunities are competitive and offered on a first-come basis. For more information, visit <u>grants.ca.gov</u>.
- Re-Opening Toolkit for Businesses and Workplaces The CDC created a <u>Toolkit for Businesses</u> and <u>Workplaces</u>. The toolkit provides guidance and tools to help business owners make decisions, protect their customers and employees, and communicate with their communities.

- Indoor Air and Coronavirus Ensuring proper ventilation with outside air can help reduce airborne contaminants indoors. When used with other best practices (such as social distancing, frequent hand washing, and surface disinfection), increasing ventilation can be part of a plan to protect yourself and your family. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has published information on Indoor Air in Homes and COVID-19, which addresses natural ventilation for homes without conditioned air. - Projections in Healthcare / Predictive Modeling The Los Angeles County <u>Department of Health Services</u> (DHS) released an updated COVID-19 <u>Projections of Hospital-based Health Care Demand through July 15</u>. The model suggests that about 1 in 230 Los Angeles County residents are currently infected and infectious to others. It also estimates that about 1 in 9 has had COVID-19. In L.A. County, COVID-19 is affecting a younger population, on average, than before. Visit <u>lacounty.gov</u> for more information.
- L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 DPH confirmed 50 new deaths and 2,741 new cases of COVID-19 in today's daily report. Of the new cases reported, 57% occurred in

people under the age of 41 years old. This continues to confirm younger people are driving new infections and the spread of COVID-19. Testing results are available for over 1,559,000 individuals, with 9.6% of all people testing positive and a daily positivity rate of 12.5% (composite of 7-day rolling average). Of the 11,371 people ever hospitalized, there are 2,218 currently hospitalized; 26% are confirmed cases in the ICU, and 18% are confirmed cases on ventilators. This is the third consecutive day of over 2, 200 hospitalizations. There are a total of 4,154 deaths; ninety-two percent of people who died had underlying health conditions.
