COVID-19 Situation Report

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Where L.A. County Stands on the States Tier System As of October 20, 2020, Los Angeles County remains in Tier One, with "widespread" risk and the most restrictions. According to the State's website, L.A. County reflects 10.1 new COVID-19 cases per day (per 100k), with an adjusted case rate for tier assignment of 7.6. The positivity rate is 3.4%; the health equity metric is 5.9% (Healthy Places Index quartile positivity rate). Los Angeles County has met the State's positivity rate metric threshold for Tier Three with "moderate" risk but remains in Tier One because the tier assignment case rate is greater than 7. When the positivity rate and case rate fall into different tiers, the stricter tier prevails.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- State's Draft Vaccination Plan and Scientific Safety Review Workgroup Governor Newsom named a Scientific Safety Review Workgroup to advise the State on COVID-19 vaccines. Several COVID-19 vaccine candidates are in clinical trials; acclaimed California physician-scientists will review the vaccine process for safety before distributing it in California. The Workgroup will also detail how safety, equity, and transparency will guide COVID-19 vaccine planning and distribution. The Scientific Safety Review Workgroup is a vital piece of the State of California Interim Draft COVID-19 Vaccination Distribution Plan. The State submitted the Distribution Plan to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention on October 16. The State plans to have a system to distribute and administer the vaccine once the supply becomes available. Visit ca.gov for more information.
- California's New COVID-19 Law: Assembly Bill (AB) 685 The State Department of Public Health published Employer Guidance on AB 685: Definitions and Employer Questions about AB 685, California's new COVID-19 law, including information on coronavirus outbreak definition and reporting. AB 685 is a new California law requiring employers to notify employees who may have been exposed to COVID-19 and report workplace outbreaks of COVID-19 to the local health department.  Research Matters final report confirms remdesivir benefits for COVID-19. The antiviral remdesivir
 shortened recovery time for patients hospitalized with COVID-19 based on results from a
 completed trial. The findings show that remdesivir alone isn't a sufficient treatment for all
 patients but does provide some benefit. Researchers are now testing remdesivir in combination

- How Secondary Disasters May Affect Children During COVID-19 The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) Technical Resources, Assistance Center, and Information Exchange (TRACIE), in collaboration with ASPR's Pediatric Centers of Excellence are collaborating on a webinar series focused on how the COVID-19 pandemic may affect children. The next webinar titled, The Effects of Secondary Disasters on Children takes place Friday, October 23 at 10:00 AM. It will focus on how secondary disasters may affect children during the COVID-19 pandemic. Panelists will discuss sheltering in place versus mass sheltering; family preparedness considerations; wildland fire preparedness and response; the potential impact associated with the 2020-2021 influenza season; planning for pediatric surge; multisystem inflammatory syndrome in children (MIS-C): epidemiology, clinical features, laboratory findings and outpatient approach; and pharmacy and supply chain considerations. - L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 DPH confirmed 39 new deaths, two new cases of COVID-19 in Manhattan Beach, and 713 new cases of COVID-19 in L.A. County in today's daily report. To date, DPH has identified 290,009 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County, and a total of 6,912 deaths. Testing results are available for more than 2,913,000 individuals, with 9% of all people testing positive. There are currently 730 confirmed cases presently hospitalized, and 30% of these people are currently cases in the ICU. To view DPH's COVID-19 Daily Data, visit lacounty.gov.
