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# **COVID-19 Situation Report**

**DECEMBER 15, 2020** 

### CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Where L.A. County Stands on the States Tier System –The State updated tier assignments today under its Blueprint for a Safer Economy the criteria used for loosening and tightening regulations on activities. Los Angeles County remains in Tier One (Purple), with "widespread" risk, the most restrictions, and many non-essential indoor business operations remain closed. L.A. County doubled its new COVID-19 cases per day (per 100K) from 41.1 to 84.4; the adjusted case rate for tier assignment is 42.2. The County's overall test positivity rate equals 11.4%; the health equity quartile positivity rate is 17.0% (see COVID-19 Health Equity Playbook for Communities). The California Department of Public Health CDPH regularly evaluates the adult ICU bed capacity for each Region, and data can be found at covid19.ca.gov. As indicated in the Order, when capacity is less than 15%, the Order's terms will apply. Today, Southern California's ICU availability is 1.7%. - "Stop the Spread" Using Your Smartphone Now more than ever, it's vital that we all do our part to stop the surge in COVID-19 cases. With a few simple device setting changes and keeping Bluetooth on (which you probably already do), you can opt-in to receive notifications when you contact someone who tested positive for the virus. California Notify does not collect your name, contact information, location, movements, or identity of the people you meet. - State Update on Youth and Adult Recreational Sports CDPH published general Guidance for Indoor and Outdoor Youth and Adult Sports Participants, Coaches and Support Staff. This guidance provides direction on outdoor and indoor youth and recreational adult sports activities to support a safe environment for these sports. The guidance applies to all organized youth sports, including school and community-sponsored programs, privately-organized clubs and leagues, and adult recreational sports. The guidance does not apply to collegiate or professional sports. Recreational sports play will be permitted based on the current Tier Assignment in each area. Given the recent surge, and as in other updates, and the City must wait for DPH guidance before recreational sports can begin in the City. Visit cdph.ca.gov for details.

## FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

- Actions in Response to COVID-19 Governor Newsom signed an Executive Order addressing a variety of issues in response to the pandemic, including extending the availability of housing for migrant agricultural workers, providing a 90-day extension on tax returns and tax payments for small businesses, and updating Cal/OSHA requirements related to quarantine guidelines.
   Governor Newsom also launched the "Vaccinate All 58" campaign, the State's campaign for a safe, fair, and equitable vaccine for all 58 counties in the State. Visit gov.ca.gov for more information.
- Safe, Fair, and Equitable Distribution of Vaccine California's Scientific Safety Review Workgroup, joined by Washington, Oregon, and Nevada, comprised of nationally acclaimed immunization and public health experts, confirmed the Pfizer vaccine is safe for public use. The Workgroup endorsed the transparency and objectivity of the FDA and CDC review processes and the rigor, validity, and reliability of their analyses; and recommends that our states avoid any undue delay in providing access to the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine. The Workgroup will continue to evaluate other COVID-19 vaccines following the federal review processes. Meanwhile, two additional teams are working to ensure equitable vaccine distribution. The Drafting Guidelines Workgroup is developing California-specific guidance for prioritizing and allocating the vaccine when supplies are limited. The Community Advisory Vaccine Committee provides input and feedback on the planning efforts and resolves equitable vaccine implementation and decision-making barriers. California is determining its distribution guidelines openly and equitably as initial vaccine supplies will be limited. Initially, vaccines will be for health care workers and those in long-term care settings following the CDPH Allocation Guidelines for COVID-19 Vaccine During Phase 1A, which aligns with CDC guidelines. This is expected to be followed by essential workers and others at the highest risk of becoming infected or severely ill with COVID-19. Visit <u>gov.ca.gov</u> for more information.
- Update on Quarantine Guidance The CDC and CDPH currently still recommend a quarantine
  period of 14 days after COVID-19 exposure, based on estimates of the upper bounds of the
  COVID-19 incubation period. However, a 14-day quarantine can impose burdens that may affect
  physical and mental health and cause economic hardship that may reduce compliance. Besides,
  the prospect of quarantine may also dissuade recently diagnosed persons from naming
  contacts and may discourage connections from responding to contact tracer outreach if they

perceive quarantine as onerous. In settings with critical staffing shortages of health care personnel, for example, the inability to provide adequate staffing for safe patient care due to quarantine is another situation impacting health outcomes. Based on these considerations, all asymptomatic close contacts may discontinue quarantine after Day 10 from the date of last exposure with or without testing. Additional restrictions are applicable. - COVID-19 Webinar Series for People with Disabilities Georgia Tech, in partnership with the CDC and the CDC Foundation, hosts a series of webinars for people with disabilities. The COVID-19 pandemic continues to have an impact on peoples' lives and mental health. People are experiencing heightened anxiety, social and physical disconnection from others, and ongoing concerns. Some unique challenges and surprising outcomes have emerged within the disability community. While many people with disabilities have faced considerable social and mental health challenges, others have reported experiencing increased inclusion and more connectedness than before. This webinar will explore various factors for understanding the mental health and resilience of people with disabilities during the COVID-19 pandemic from their perspective. The discussion will also center on how service providers can access resources to support their services and learn how to recognize the signs of mental health difficulties within the disability community. - Regional ICU Capacity Calculation How is daily regional available ICU capacity calculated? The State began publishing ICU availability calculations by Regions on December 4 after the Regional Stay Home Order was announced on December 3, 2020. Hospitals are required to submit information on the total number of available staffed ICU beds daily. This includes both existing staffed ICU beds and staffed ICU surge beds. To calculate regional ICU capacity, the total number of adult ICU beds is calculated by removing neonatal ICU beds (NICU) and pediatric intensive care unit beds (PICU) and standardizing current adult ICU capacity. Consistent with the Regional Stay Home Order's goal, this calculation ensures that sufficient ICU bed capacity is available for COVID and non-COVID related conditions. The State posts ICU capacity by Region daily and maintains a dashboard on hospital and ICU capacity by County. - Responding to Vaccine Hesitancy and Misinformation Webinar The National Emerging Special Pathogen Training and Education Center (NETEC) hosts COVID-19 webinars bringing together subject matter experts immersed in the many challenges and topics around coronavirus. - California Rebuilding Fund for Small Businesses/Borrowers The California Rebuilding Fund is a public-private partnership that is aggregating funding from private, philanthropic, and public sector sources. The Fund includes a \$25 million anchor commitment from IBank to address California's small businesses' capital and advisory needs as they reopen and recover from the COVID-19 health and economic crisis. California small businesses employ almost 50% of the State's workforce and are vital to restoring economic activity, retaining quality jobs, and driving development in communities most affected by COVID-19. Many small business operations will be able to retool, rebuild, and reopen if they can access affordable credit available at <a href="mailto:ibank.ca.gov">ibank.ca.gov</a>.
- Federal Unemployment Benefits Set to Expire Federal unemployment payments that have been available for workers who do not qualify for regular state unemployment benefits and for those who run out of all of their state benefits will expire after December 26, 2020. The State Employment Development Department (EDD) launched an outreach effort to ensure Californians are aware of the upcoming end to the federal CARES Act funding and associated benefits. Absent congressional action, benefit payments are set to expire for the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) and the Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) recipients starting December 27, 2020, impacting an estimated 750,000 Californians. Regular unemployment insurance claims will continue to be paid as long as the claim is within the associated benefit year. The State has helpful resources such as CalFresh food benefits at

- FTC Warns Public to Beware of COVID-19 Vaccine Scams The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) warns the public that while waiting for more information on your timeline, where and how to get your COVID-19 vaccine, scammers are scheming. If you get a call, text, or email claiming early access to the vaccine, STOP. That's a scam. Do not pay for a promise of vaccine access or share personal information. Instead, report it to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov or file a complaint with the California Office of Attorney General. - L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 –

  DPH confirmed 86 new deaths, ten new cases of COVID-19 in Manhattan Beach, and 11,194 new cases in Today's Daily Report. This is the highest number of daily deaths reported since the summer surge. There are 4,403 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized, and 21% of these people are in the ICU. Hospitalizations have increased 4-fold since November 16. The number of people hospitalized was 1,049 on November 16 and over 4,400 today. According to the State, the Southern California Region has 1.7% ICU capacity remaining. Testing results are available for approximately 4,175,051 individuals, with 12% of all people testing positive.

During this time of an extraordinarily high number of cases and hospitalizations and increasing numbers of deaths, it is more important than ever that businesses carefully follow DPH requirements and be fully compliant with the Health Officer Order's safeguards and modifications protocols. Public Health's compliance teams continue to visit businesses across the County every day, review public health protocols with business owners, identify deficiencies, and issue citations for companies out of compliance. From November 29 through December 6, 20 citations were issued to businesses, including restaurants, gyms, and indoor malls, for noncompliance with Health Officer Orders. Since the end of August, a total of 433 citations have been issued. A list of non-compliant businesses that received citations can be found on publichealth.lacounty.gov.
