COVID-19 Situation Report

DECEMBER 17, 2020

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- **0% ICU Capacity Remaining in Region** – According to the State, the Southern California Region has 0% ICU capacity remaining. For reference, the Southern California region is comprised of: Imperial, Inyo, Los Angeles, Mono, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara and Ventura counties. According to officials, once ICU beds are full, hospitals go into surge mode, which can accommodate 20% over usual capacity.
- **Second COVID-19 Vaccine (Moderna) Endorsed** - A second COVID-19 vaccine, the Moderna vaccine, was endorsed today by the FDA’s Advisory Committee, and based on the publicly released findings of the vaccine trial, Public Health is hopeful the vaccine will receive Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) very soon. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunizations Practices will meet this weekend to discuss the recommended use of the Moderna vaccine and will also vote on additional priority populations to receive it.
- **“Stop the Spread” Using Your Smartphone** - Now more than ever, it's vital that we all do our part to stop the surge in COVID-19 cases. With a few simple device setting changes and keeping Bluetooth on (which you probably already do), you can opt-in to receive notifications when you contact someone who tested positive for the virus.
