CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Holiday Gatherings Prohibited Public Health warns that without a change in how we
 celebrate the winter holidays, Los Angeles County will experience a surge on top of a surge on
 top of a surge. Hospitals are over capacity and the high-quality medical care we are all
 accustomed to in LA County is beginning to be compromised as our frontline healthcare workers
 are beyond stretched to the limit. Since the beginning of the surge in November, cases have
 increased by a staggering 862%. Stay home as much as possible and do not gather with
 anyone outside of your immediate household.
- Changes to the Health Officer Order Los Angeles County Department continues to update their Health Officer Order. All elements of the Order and protocols must be followed.
- Vaccine Update Los Angeles County received its first shipment of the Pfizer vaccine with a second shipment anticipated to arrive this week, for a total 131,623 doses. Distribution efforts are aimed at vaccinating everyone in a phased approach as outlined by the County's Vaccine Distribution Prioritization Plan. Healthcare workers and people who live nursing homes and other long-term care facilities are being offered the first doses of the COVID-19 vaccines. It is a scam if someone offers to sell you the COVID-19 vaccine or a chance to get vaccinated before it's your turn. The vaccine will be given to Los Angeles County residents at no cost and regardless of immigration status.
- Stop the Spread Using Your Smartphone Now more than ever, it's vital that we all do our part to stop the surge in COVID-19 cases. With a few simple device setting changes and keeping Bluetooth on (which you probably already do), you can opt-in to receive notifications when you contact someone who tested positive for the virus.
