COVID-19 Situation Report APRIL 1, 2021

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- Vaccination Update Starting today, Thursday, April 1, residents 50 through 64 years old are eligible for COVID-19 vaccine. Additionally, on April 15, vaccines become available to any resident in Los Angeles County who is 16 and older. All persons getting a vaccination will need to provide identification (government ID not required) and proof that they live within LA County at their appointment. Immigration status is not required and will not be asked for at any vaccination site. All forms of acceptable documentation are available at www.vaccinateLACounty.com.
- Spring Break Staycation With Spring Break upon us, DPH and the City encourages everyone to remain close to home. Travel increases the risk of getting and spreading COVID-19. While COVID-19 numbers have decreased locally, transmission remains widespread and growing in many states and countries. Los Angeles County residents should continue to avoid all nonessential travel and stay within 120 miles from their place of residence unless traveling for essential purposes. The State Travel Advisory remains in effect in Los Angeles County. Recreational travelers and residents coming to L.A. County must follow California Department of Public Health (CDPH) COVID-19 Quartine Guidance to self-quarantine for ten days upon return from out-of-state or out-of-country travel. Remain at your home or lodging for the ten days and avoid contact with others. Do not travel if you are sick. If you have COVID-19 symptoms, were in crowds, exposed to unmasked individuals nearby, or attended gatherings, get tested.

FEDERAL, STATE, AND COUNTY UPDATES

• L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 – DPH confirmed 53 recent deaths, two new cases in Manhattan Beach, and 757 new COVID-19 cases in Today's Daily Report. To date, DPH identified 1,220,246 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 23,189 deaths. There are 652 people with COVID-19 currently hospitalized, and 25% of these people are in the ICU. Testing results are available for approximately 6,102,000 individuals, with 19% of all people testing positive. Today's daily test positivity rate is 1.6%. To view Statewide case statistics and demographics, including positive cases, deaths, and testing results, visit COVID:19 California Case Statistics. As part of its commitment to reduce health inequities and ensure the best outcomes for all Californians, the State has a Health Equity Dashboard that tracks California's health equity measure and data by race and ethnicity, sexual orientation, and gender identity. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) added County View to their national COVID Data Tracker, providing case statistics by County throughout the United States.
