The Mira Costa boys lacrosse team suffered a couple of losses at home in two close games that both went into overtime.

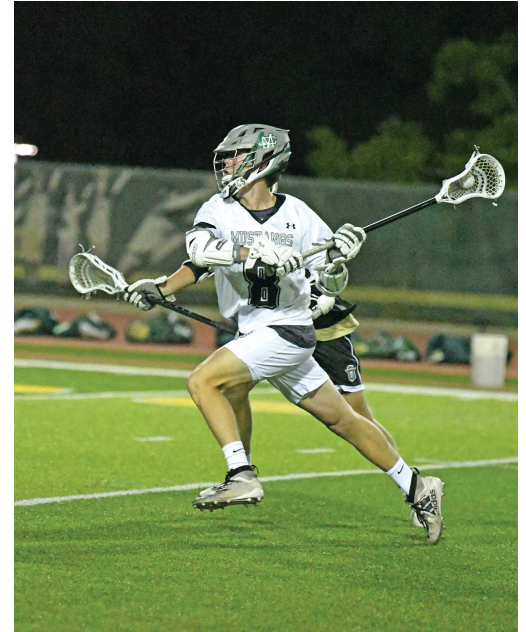
On April 14, the Mustangs lost to Servite 10-9. Attacker Jack Storer had four goals, with Trey Mora adding two goals with one assist. Sophomore goalie Simon Ferris recorded 12 saves on the day. Also helping get points on the board were Diego Carpenter with one goal and two assists, Pat Kupiec with one goal and Colin Shaw with one goal.

On April 16, after double overtime, Costa lost to St. Francis 9-8. Goalie Ferris contributed 14 saves, with Mora scoring three goals and two assists. Storer recorded two goals with one assist. Rounding out the scoring were Diego Carpenter with one goal and one assist, Thomas Southey with one goal and Colin Shaw with one goal.

According to parent Stan Fiorito, who filed the stats and photos for this game, the Mustangs have been on the ropes a bit. But, he said, with football ending and some players coming back from injury, "they are young, they are hungry and ready to mix it up in the Bay League."
