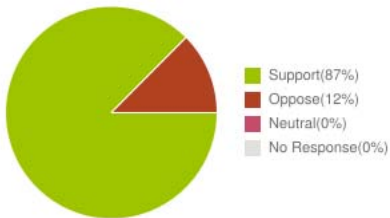

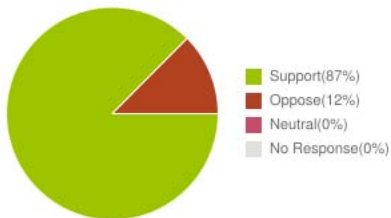

Overall Sentiment

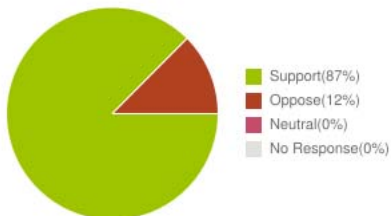
