COVID-19 Situation Report

JULY 22, 2021

CURRENT INITIATIVES AND UPDATES

- County Requires Masks Indoors Regardless of Vaccination Status Until further notice, the
 Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (DPH) has modified the <u>Health Officer Order</u> to
 require universal masking while indoors, regardless of vaccination status. People who are not
 vaccinated are at the highest risk of getting infected with COVID-19. Unvaccinated adults who
 are older or who have certain medical conditions are at highest risk of severe COVID-19 disease.
 To reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection:
 - o Get Vaccinated. It is the best way to protect against COVID-19.
 - Wear a mask that fits. Your mask is one of the most powerful tools you have to protect yourself and others.
 - o Avoid crowded places. Being in crowds, especially indoors, puts you at a higher risk.
 - Wash your hands and/or use hand sanitizer often especially after being in public spaces where surfaces are touched by many people. Avoid eating and touching your face with unwashed hands.
 - Stay home when sick. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, talk to a doctor and get a
 test, even if you are fully vaccinated. You should stay home and away from others
 until you get the result of your COVID-19 test or until your provider tells you that you
 don't have COVID-19.

In Los Angeles County, everyone 2 years of age and older must wear a mask in all indoor public places, regardless of their vaccination status. Everyone, regardless of vaccination status, must continue to wear a mask on all public transit and transit hubs, at all health care settings, correctional facilities, shelters and cooling centers, and schools and day care facilities. For masks to work properly, they need to completely cover your nose and mouth and fit snugly against the sides of your face and around your nose.

- Still Need to Get Your Vaccine? If you are eligible for a vaccine but have not yet been vaccinated, consider getting vaccinated now. L.A. County continues to offer vaccines at many different sites across the county to make it as easy as possible for eligible L.A. County residents to get vaccinated. This week, there are 771 sites offering vaccinations including pharmacies, clinics, community sites, and hospitals and 329 sites where mobile teams will be offering vaccinations, which are concentrated in higher-need, harder hit areas. You can obtain vaccines at County-run sites, all the LA City-run sites, almost all mobile sites, and many community sites without an appointment. - Vaccination Sweepstakes Beginning tomorrow, Friday, July 23 through next Thursday, July 29 at County-run vaccination sites, LA City sites, and St. John's Well Child and Family Center

• L.A. County Daily Briefing Statistics on COVID-19 – Los Angeles County continues to see a rapid rise in COVID-19 transmission countywide with cases doubling over the last 10 days. The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (Public Health) confirms 2,767 new cases of COVID-19; an 80% increase over last week and 13 new deaths. Of the 13 new deaths reported today, eight people that passed away were over the age of 80, one person who passed was between the ages of 65 and 79, two people who passed were between the ages of 50 and 64, and two people who passed were between the ages of 30 and 49. To date, Public Health identified 1,276,137 positive cases of COVID-19 across all areas of L.A. County and a total of 24,607 deaths. Testing results are available for more than 7,213,000 individuals with 16% of people testing positiveTesting results are available for nearly 7,190,000 individuals with 16% of people testing positive.
